

# The Returned & Services League of Australia WA branch incorporated

Hi Lorraine,

It gives me great pleasure to be sending you this email regards.

The Dawn service at Kondinin Yeerakine Rock with its publicity on the ABC a few days after Anzac Day, caused some comments around the RSLWA Board. Regarding a small town getting behind the spirit of Anzac Day.

The Board has asked me to ask Kondinin RSL Sub-Branch to give us your Anzac Day presentation, plus information in the Kondinin Calendar, the Yeerakine Rock murals, plus some photos, 4/5 would be great. We would like permission to reproduce these articles and photos in the listening Post magazine.

The RSL Listening Post magazine which goes out to thousands of Western Australian service personal and veterans, it would be great if you can do this because it will give everyone who reads the article, to realize just how proud these small towns are of the Anzacs and their own heritage.

It of course it gave me a chance to indulge some more on small country towns within our state. As I am a expat from the Kondinin community of some fifty years and I am now the State Vice President of the RSLWA.

I pointed out to the board that the Kondinin Shire, or I should say Roads Board of Kondinin at that time in 1914-15 a very high percentage of their young men joined the 1st AIF, especially in the Western Australian Battalions being the 11th/16th/28th and the 10th Light Horse. These being the early raised units in W.A.

All these Battalions and the 10th Light Horse all served at Gallipoli and sustained very heavy casualties during this part of the 1st World War.

On the Honour Boards of Kondinin, Kulin, Narembeen, Corrigin and Bruce Rock, there is over 1500 names of young soldiers who served their country. To put that in prospective that 1.5 Battalions supplied by 5 towns. If you took that many people out of those 5 towns today, they would be skeleton towns or non-existing. Quite incredible for a very young nation in 1914/1918. The compassion of those young men for their country is incredible.

Every town suffered and I know Kondinin did with the soldiers who did not return have a little star against their name on the honour boards in your town hall.

I emphasised to the Board that these country towns still have family members of those young men who served working farms etc in their respective shires.

What has happened at Yerrakine Rock is the reflection of what the country people of today who wish to respect the sacrifice of these young men from their town in 1914/1918 war. It also reminds the younger generation of their town heritage and history. Which is important these days.

From my early days in Kondinin, I had the good fortune to have known 3 - 1st World War Veterans and quite a few 2nds World War Veterans. There is none of those old gentlemen left today. So, it makes me as a Vietnam Veteran, very proud to know the spirit of our country towns, especially Kondinin still respects the sacrifice of our first Anzacs and those of the wars which followed keeping the Anzac legend alive today. As our ADF personal today can only build on the legend that was formed so many years ago.

I was honoured to be able to speak about country towns, to the RSLWA Board and let them know RSL Sub-Branch all getting smaller but their endeavour to make sure the Anzacs are not forgotten. and the legend is well and truly alive.

Thanking you all.

# SAFE CYCLING EVENT

To mark the completion of new pathway from the Kondinin Hospital to the Kondinin Information Bay the Shire of Kondinin in conjunction with the Kondinin CRC held a safe cycling event on Wednesday 28th June 2023 to coincide with SOCK week. The shared path was jointly funded by the Department of Transport and the Shire of Kondinin through a Western Australian Bicycle Network grant.

Twenty four participants, including Shire President, Kent Mouritz, school children and TLG Tutors, started at the school and headed down the path to the Information Bay. There they were divided into groups and given the activity, which involved finding letters at places along the path through the use of a small photo of the place. This involved riding from the Information Bay up to the Hospital. The jumbled letters spelt Save Our Country Kids. Once participants were finished they enjoyed afternoon tea at the Community Garden, including potatoes cooked in the fire, and the ever popular, marshmallows toasted on sticks.

This new pathway is a welcome addition to town improving the safety of pedestrians and cyclists and creating greater connections between key services and amenities. The concrete pathway was constructed by Kondinin Building Services (Stubbs Street to the Information Bay) and TD Ibbotson (Kondinin Hospital to Stubbs Street).



# REPTILES AND FAIR GAMES





# Chicken Cutlets with Sun-Dried Tomato Cream Sauce

 Total Time: 20 minutes

 Serves: 4



## Ingredients

- 1 pound chicken cutlets
- ¼ teaspoon salt, divided
- ¼ teaspoon ground pepper, divided
- ½ cup slivered oil-packed sun-dried tomatoes, plus 1 tablespoon oil from the jar
- ½ cup finely chopped shallots
- ½ cup dry white wine
- ½ cup heavy cream
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley

## Method

1. Sprinkle chicken with 1/8 teaspoon each salt and pepper. Heat sun-dried tomato oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Add the chicken and cook, turning once, until browned and an instant-read thermometer inserted into the thickest part registers 165°F, about 6 minutes total. Transfer to a plate.
2. Add sun-dried tomatoes and shallots to the pan. Cook, stirring, for 1 minute. Increase heat to high and add wine. Cook, scraping up any browned bits, until the liquid has mostly evaporated, about 2 minutes. Reduce heat to medium and stir in cream, any accumulated juices from the chicken and the remaining 1/8 teaspoon each salt and pepper; simmer for 2 minutes. Return the chicken to the pan and turn to coat with the sauce. Serve the chicken topped with the sauce and parsley.
