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Executive summary

This report has been prepared by GHD Pty Ltd (GHD) on behalf of Kondinin Energy Pty Ltd (Kondinin Energy) in support of a development application for up to 46 wind turbines, a 125ha solar farm and energy storage system (the proposed development). The proposed development is located approximately 270 km east of Perth and 5 km north of the Kondinin townsite. The project site encompasses 19 freehold lots with a total area of 3,105 ha.

The proposed development was granted approval by the Regional Joint Development Assessment Panel (DAP) on 9 November 2018 (the original approval).

During the COVID-19 global pandemic, the Minister for Planning issued a 'Notice of Exemption' under the *Emergency Management Act 2005*. The notice had the effect of extending the term in which the development must be substantially commenced from 9 November 2023 to 9 November 2025.

Kondinin Energy has been pursuing implementation of the proposed development in the years following the original approval, taking several actions including:

- Satisfying conditions of the original approval
- Carrying out environmental assessments, including undertaking Aboriginal Ethnographic and Archaeological Survey and Site Contamination Survey
- Evaluating and selecting a preferred Engineering Procurement and Construction (EPC) contractor.
- Committing funds to early work design packages with Western Power to mature the connection application.

Despite being in the late stages leading to project commencement, Kondinin Energy seeks approval for an extension to the term of the original approval to make final arrangements for project construction. The extension to the term of the original approval will provide confidence to remaining technical and economic decisions.

This report supports an application for development approval for:

- An amendment to the original development approval to extend to the term in which the development must be substantially commenced
- The amended term being equivalent to 24 months from the date the original approval is due to lapse (in not substantially commenced), being 9 November 2027.

This report submits that the proposed amendments should be approved given that:

- The relevant planning framework has not substantially changed since the original approval
- The proposed development would likely receive approval now
- Kondinin Energy has actively pursued implementation of the development approval
- The requested extension period is reasonable and will enable construction of the proposed development to commence.

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1. Introduction

1.1 Purpose of this report

The purpose of this report is to provide information relating to the proposed development and material accompanying the development application.

This report supports an application for development approval that extends the term in which the development must be substantially commenced. This report sets out the reasons that the proposed amendments should be approved.

1.2 Scope and limitations

2. Proposed development

2.1 Development description

The KWSF project is located approximately 270 km east of Perth, 5 km north of the Kondinin townsite. The project site is located in the Shire of Kondinin and consists of existing broadacre farming lots dissected by Notting-Karlgarin Road, Kondinin. The project site encompasses 19 freehold lots with a total area of 3,105ha (refer Table 1.

The proposed project consists of up to 46 wind turbines, a 125ha solar farm and energy storage system. The project will have an operational footprint of approximately 260ha. The project was approved by the Regional Joint Development Assessment Panel (DAP/18/01477) on 9 November 2018.

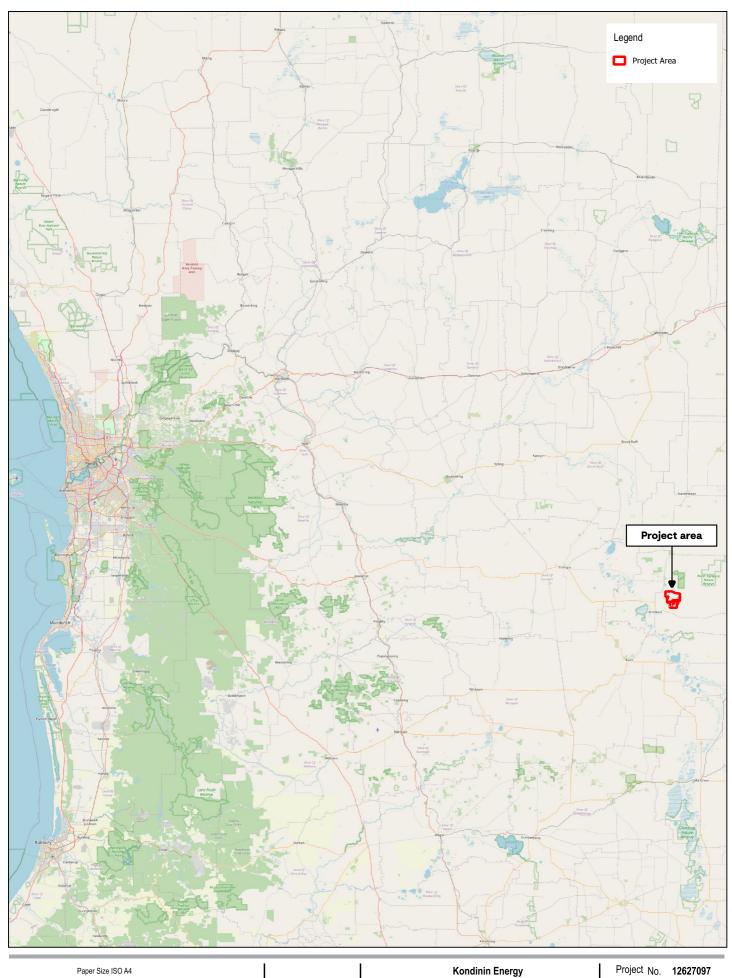
The proposed development also includes the following:

- Approximately 19.5 km of compacted gravel capped access roads
- Underground trenched cabling
- Site compound (approx. 15,000 sqm)
- Office buildings for Contractors and Principal, crib rooms, first aid room, toilets
- Laydown area which may include storage containers, workshop and warehouse facilities, fuel storage tanks, and a geotech lab
- Washdown facilities, O&M compound (approx. 2,800 sqm) and facilities
- Perimeter fencing to site facilities.

The project's locational context is shown in Figure 1. Facility components are summarised in Table 2. The projects footprint covers the same lots/land involved in the original approval.

2.2 Previous development approval

On 9 August 2018, Kondinin Energy submitted an application for development approval for the proposed development. The application was supported by a series of technical reports outlining the extent of impact caused by the project and the potential mitigations. The application was approved on 9 November 2018 by the RJDAP, subject to several conditions:

4	Prior to any development being undertaken onsite, a Construction Management Plan shall be submitted to the Local Government for approval. Once approved the Construction Management Plan shall be implemented at all times to the satisfaction of the Local Government during the construction phase.
5	Prior to any development being undertaken onsite, an Operational Management Plan shall be submitted to the Local Government for approval. Once approved the Operational Management Plan shall be implemented at all times to the satisfaction of the Local Government during the operational phase.
6	Prior to any development being undertaken onsite, a Traffic Management Plan, including dilapidation reporting and repair mechanisms shall be submitted to the Local Government upon receipt of advice from Main Roads WA for approval. Once approved the Traffic Management Plan shall be implemented at all times to the satisfaction of the Local Government.
7	The Proponent shall ensure the installation of any traffic warning/safety signage in relation to the approved development during the transportation, construction and decommissioning phases is to the satisfaction of the Local Government upon receipt of advice from Main Roads WA.
8	The location, design, construction and maintenance of all internal vehicle access roads, manoeuvring and parking areas as well as access and egress points from the development site to the local road network, including all associated stormwater drainage and signage, shall be to the satisfaction of the Local Government.
9	Prior to any development being undertaken onsite, a Noise Management and Monitoring Plan shall be submitted to the Local Government (upon advice from the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation) for approval. Once approved the Noise Management and Monitoring Plan shall be implemented at all times to the satisfaction of the Local Government.
10	If any buildings are proposed to be constructed on the land in areas designated by the Fire and Emergency Services Commissioner as being bushfire prone, the Proponent shall, prior to any development being undertaken on-site, prepare and submit a Bushfire Management Plan to the Local Government for approval. Once approved the Bushfire Management Plan shall be implemented at all times to the satisfaction of the Local Government upon advice from the Department of Fire and Emergency Services.

11	Prior to any development being undertaken onsite, a Stormwater Management Plan shall be submitted to the Local Government for approval. Once approved the Stormwater Management Plan shall be implemented at all times to the satisfaction of the Local Government.
12	Prior to any development being undertaken onsite, the Aviation Impact Assessment prepared by Aviation Projects dated 10 July 2018 shall be updated and submitted to the Local Government for approval on advice from the Civil Aviation Safety Authority and or Air Services Australia as necessary.

15	In conjunction with the decommissioning of the development, the Proponent shall rehabilitate the site to the satisfaction of the local government with advice received from affected landowners to enable broadacre farming or other approved farming activity to resume/continue.
16	No signs or hoardings are to be erected in relation to the development without the separate approval of the Local Government.
17	The Proponent shall advise the Local Government of completion of construction of the development, including any individual stages once completed.

2.3 Ministerial Notice of Exemption for the COVID-19 pandemic

Condition 2 of the original approval stipulates that the development shall be substantially commenced within a period of 5 years from the date of approval, as follows:

'The approved development shall be substantially commenced within a period of 5 years from the date of this approval and if the development is not substantially commenced within this period the approval shall lapse and be of no further effect. Where an approval has so lapsed, no development shall be carried out without the further approval of the Local Government having first being sought and obtained.'

On 4 March 2022 the Minister for Emergency Services declared a 'State of Emergency' in Western Australia due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Clause 78H of the *Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations* 2015 (the Regulations) allows the Minister for Planning to issue a 'Notice of Exemption', which has the effect of temporarily overriding requirements of local and state planning schemes.

Several 'Notices of Exemption' were issued over the course of the State of Emergency period.

Clause 4.2 of the 8 April 2022 Notice of Exemption provided for a 2-year extension to the time in which an approved development must be substantially commenced. This exemption applied to planning approvals that were 'current' during the State of Emergency period. The original approval was current during this period and as a result it was granted additional two years of validity.

2.4 Approval to lapse

As a result of the original approval and the Ministerial Notice of Exemption issued March 2022, the development approval for the project is due to lapse on 9 November 2025.

2.5 Information submitted to the Shire

Since the original approval, Kondinin Energy has pursued implementation of the proposed development. This includes preparing the information required to satisfy the conditions of the original development approval.

On 30 November 2023, the following technical reports were submitted to the Shire:

- Noise Management and Monitoring Plan (NMMP)
- Bushfire Memorandum

On 21 December 2023, the Shire advised that it approved the NMMP and supported to recommendations of the Bushfire Memorandum (refer **Appendix A**).

At its meeting of 16 October 2024, the Shire considered an item titled '9.1.1 Endorsement of supporting documentations – Proposed Kondinin Wind Farm (DAP18/0477)'. The item included several technical appendices intended to support implementation of the project and the address the conditions of the original development approval, including:

- Construction and Operational Management Plan (CMP/OMP)
- Traffic Management Plan (TMP)
- Stormwater Management Plan (SMP)

In determining the item, the Shire made the following decision:

'ENDORSES the Planning Report attached in support of the conditions of development approval issued by the Mid-West/Wheatbelt JDAP at its meeting on the 9th November 2018 for a Renewable Energy Facility on 19 freehold agricultural lots located approximately 5km north and north-east of the Kondinin townsite comprising up to 46 wind turbines, a 125ha solar farm, energy storage and all associated transmission corridors and infrastructure, subject to further information on items relating to bushfire management, water management and waste management.'

Advice issued by the Shire dated 22 October 2024 (refer **Appendix B**) more specifically set out the modifications sought, as follows:

- Section 4.4 of the CMP/OMP be updated to incorporate more details relating to the projects water sourcing strategy
- Section 6.2 of the CMP/OMP be updated to provide more detail on bushfire emergency response and adherence to Vehicle Movement and Harvest Bans
- Section 6.3 of the CMP/OMP by updated to provide greater details regarding waste collection, quantities and disposal.

At the time of writing this report, updates to the CMP/OMP were in progress for consideration by the Shire in early 2025.

While not required as part of a condition of approval, an Electromagnetic Interference Study (EMI) was considered by the Shire at its meeting of 13 December 2024 (refer item 9.1.3). The study is currently undergoing revisions with an updated version expected to be considered by the Shire in early 2025.

2.6 Clearance of development conditions

Based on the information considered by the Shire to date, Table 4 provides an overview of the status of the conditions of the original approval.

2.7 Election for Shire to determine application

Regulation 77 of the *Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015* (PD Regulations) allows an application granted approval under a local planning scheme to be amended or cancelled. This includes extending the time in which substantial commencement must have occurred (refer r. 77(1)(a)).

Regulation 17A of the *Planning and Development (Development Assessment Panels) Regulations 2011* allows a development application previously determined by a DAP to be determined by the 'responsible authority', in this case the Shire (refer r. 17A(1)). Kondinin Energy has elected to have this application determined by the Shire in lieu of the DAP.

2.8 Further project implementation actions

Kondinin Energy is currently pursuing the following project implementation actions:

- Updates to the AIA and preparation of submission of detailed development plans to the Shire (as per condition 3 of the original approval)
- Finalisation of power off-take agreements
- Planning for the project's construction accommodation camp
- Further consultation regarding construction material and water sourcing.

After determination of this development application Kondinin Energy will pursue the following additional tasks:

- Transport delivery route survey, progressing relevant road works designs and clearing permits
- Final geotechnical survey
- Site mobilisation activities and construction of internal road networks.

3. Planning considerations

3.1 State planning framework

Since the original approval, minor modifications to the applicable planning framework have occurred.

3.1.1 SPP3.7 – Bushfire

SPP3.7 Bushfire directs how land use should address bushfire risk management in Western Australia. It applies to all land designated as bushfire prone. There are some areas of remnant vegetation within project site which are identified as bushfire prone.

SPP3.7 received a significant update in November 2024. The amendment relates to how land is designated bushfire prone and the appropriate planning response when habitable buildings are proposed within bushfire prone areas. The updated has been reviewed to confirm that SPP3.7 does not stipulate the requirement for preparation of a Bushfire Management Plan (BMP) for renewable energy facilities.

As with the original approval, SPP3.7 continues to control the development of habitable buildings on land designated bushfire prone. The proposal includes habitable buildings, including:

- Operations and maintenance facility
- Site facilities compound.

These buildings are located outside of bushfire prone areas. Given that no habitable buildings are proposed to be located within a bushfire prone area, a bushfire management plan is not required.

3.1.2 Renewable Energy Facility Position Statement

In March 2020, the Department of Planning Lands and Heritage (DPLH) released a position statement on renewable energy facilities. The statement provides guidance on the appropriate development of renewable facilities to both decision makers and proponents. A summary of relevant considerations and how they are addressed by the project is provided in Table 5.

3.2 Local planning framework

Shire of Kondinin Local Planning Scheme No. 1 (LPS1) controls how land can be used and developed across the Shire. It sets out requirements for development applications depending on the intended land use and existing zoning.

LPS1 was gazetted in December 2004 and was most recently amended on 9 January 2018. The development was approved in November 2018, under the current version of the Scheme.

The subject site remains zoned 'Rural', and there have been no improvement schemes, special control areas or local development plans introduced since 2018.

There have been no amendments to existing local planning policies which affect the proposal, and no new local planning policies have been introduced which require consideration. The Shire has not published an endorsed local planning strategy.

4. Orderly and proper planning

Kondinin Energy seeks approval to amend the original approval to amended term in which the development must be substantially commenced to being equivalent to 24 months from the date the original approval is due to lapse, being 9 November 2027 (amendment request).

While a decision maker is not limited in its consideration of the amendment request, the State Administrative Tribunal in *Georgio Property 2 Pty Ltd v the Presiding Member of the Metro West Joint Development Assessment Panel [WASAT 138; 2017]* set out the relevant factors to be considered when determining an application to extend the term of a planning approval:

- Whether the planning framework has changed substantially since the development approval was granted;
- Whether the development would likely receive approval now.
- Whether the holder of the development approval has actively and relatively conscientiously pursued the implementation of the development approval.
- Whether the total extension period is reasonable.

5. Conclusion

Kondinin Energy seeks approval for an extension to the term of the original approval to make final arrangements for project construction. The project is moving into late stages of delivery and additional time to implement the project will provide confidence to remaining technical and economic decisions.

This report supports an application for development approval for:

- An amendment to the original development approval to extend to the term in which the development must be substantially commenced
- The amended term being equivalent to 24 months from the date the original approval is due to lapse (in not substantially commenced), being 9 November 2027.

Kondinin Energy has been pursuing implementation of the proposed development in the preceding years, taking several actions including:

- Actioning conditions of the original approval
- Undertaking environmental assessments
- Evaluating and selecting a preferred Engineering Procurement and Construction (EPC) contractor
- Committing funds to early work design packages with Western Power to mature the connection application.

This report submits that the proposed amendments should be approved given that:

- The relevant planning framework has not substantially changed since the original approval
- The proposed development would likely receive approval now
- Kondinin Energy has actively pursued implementation of the development approval
- The requested extension period is reasonable to enable construction of the proposed development to commence.

Waste Management

Section 6.3 of Construction Management and Operational Plan. Information on this is vague in places and needs to be made clearer on collection, quantities, where it will be deposited and fees applicable.

1 BASIS OF PREPARATION AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF PREPARATION

The financial report comprises general purpose financial statements which have been prepared in accordance with the *Local Government Act 1995* and accompanying regulations.

Local Government Act 1995 requirements

Section 6.4(2) of the Local Government Act 1995 read with the *Local Government (Financial Management)*Regulations 1996 prescribe that the financial report be prepared in accordance with the Local Government Act 1995 and, to the extent that they are not inconsistent with the Act, the Australian Accounting Standards. The Australian Accounting Standards (as they apply to local governments and not-for-profit entities) and Interpretations of the Australian Accounting Standards Board were applied where no inconsistencies exist.

The Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996 specify that vested land is a right-of-use asset to be measured at cost, and is considered a zero cost concessionary lease. All right-of-use assets under zero cost concessionary leases are measured at zero cost rather than at fair value, except for vested improvements on concessionary land leases such as roads, buildings or other infrastructure which continue to be reported at fair value, as opposed to the vested land which is measured at zero cost. The measurement of vested improvements at fair value is a departure from AASB 16 which would have required the Shire to measure any vested improvements at zero cost. Accounting policies which have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise. Except for cash flow and rate setting information, the financial report has been prepared on the accrual basis and is based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and liabilities.

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT REPORTING ENTITY

All funds through which the Shire controls resources to carry on its functions have been included in the financial statements forming part of this financial report.

All monies held in the Trust Fund are excluded from the financial statements.

Judgements and estimates

The preparation of a financial report in conformity with Australian Accounting Standards requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that effect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expenses.

The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The balances, transactions and disclosures impacted by accounting estimates are as follows:

- * estimated fair value of certain financial assets
- * impairment of financial assets
- * estimation fair values of land and buildings, infrastructure and investment property
- * estimation of uncertainties made in relation to lease accounting
- * estimated useful life of intangible assets

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

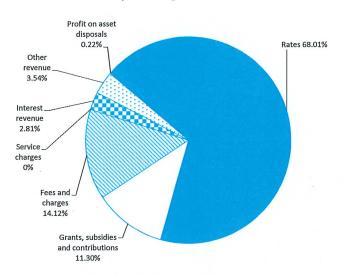

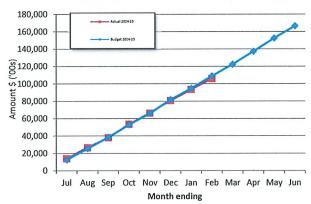

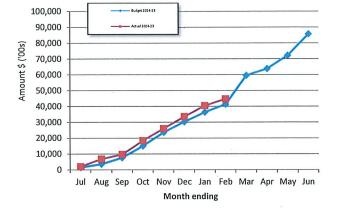
Operating Revenue





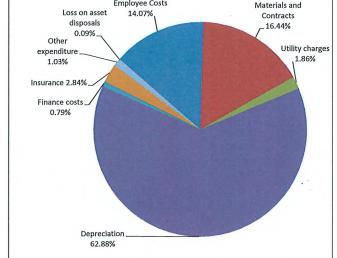


Budget Capital Expenses -v- Actual

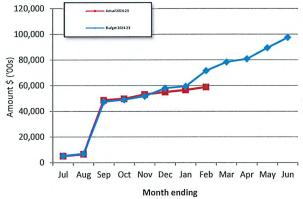

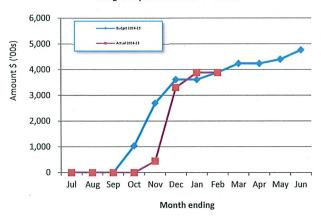
Operating Expenditure

Provisions are measure using the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

Employee Related Provisions

Short-term employee benefits

Provision is made for the Shire's obligations for short-term employee benefits. Short-term employee benefits are benefits (other than termination benefits) that are expected to be settled wholly before 12 months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service, including wages, salaries and sick leave.

Short-term employee benefits are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled.

The Shire's obligations for short-term employee benefits such as wages, salaries and sick leave are recognised as part of the current trade and other payables in the calculation of net current assets.

Other long-term employee benefits

The Shire's obligations for employees annual leave and long service leave entitlements are recognised as employee related provisions in the statement of financial position.

Long-term employee benefits are measured at the present value of the expected future payments to be made to employees. Expected future payments incorporate anticipate future wage and salary levels, durations of service and employee departures and are discounted at rates determind by reference to market yields at the end of the reporting period on government bonds that have maturity dates that approximate the terms of the obligations.

Any remeasurements for changes in assumptions of obligations for other long-term employee benefits are presented as non-current provisions in its statement of financial position, except where the Shire does not have an unconditional right to defer settlementfor at lease 12 months after the end of the reporting period, in which case the obligations are presented as current provisions.

Contract liabilities

Capital grant/contribution liabilities

C Henderer also mentioned that the 12 Million could be better spent on Housing rather than a visitor's centre. A Willans also wanted to look into this.

D Biglin – also asked regarding the clean-up of properties CEO replied that it is an ongoing process and that Council are always looking to keep properties to a standard.

CLOSURE

There being no further business the Deputy President thanked those in attendance and closed the meeting at 6.24pm.

Cost Estimate Letter: 2025 Local Government Ordinary Election

As you are aware, the next local government ordinary election will be held on 18 October 2025. This letter is your Cost Estimate for the Western Australian Electoral Commission to conduct your election, should you proceed with making a declaration under the *Local Government Act 1995* for us to do so.

Cost Estimate

The Commission has estimated the cost to conduct your Council's election in 2025 as a postal election at approximately \$12,352 (ex GST).

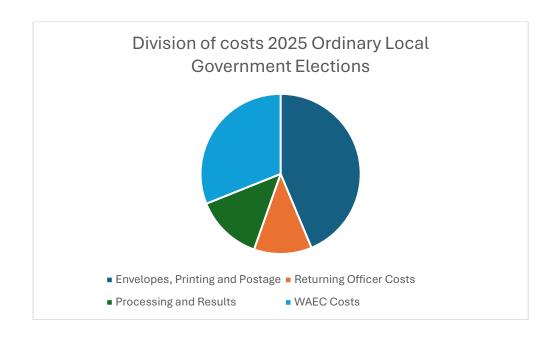
This cost has been based on the following assumptions:

- The method of election will be postal;
- 4 Councillor(s) vacancies;
- 600 electors:
- response rate of approximately 65%
- appointment of a local Returning Officer; and
- count to be conducted at your office using CountWA.

If any of these assumptions are not correct, please contact us and we can provide a new cost estimate.

Cost Methodology

To provide your estimate, the Commission has estimated the costs of all aspects of the election, from supply of materials to staffing costs. For the 2025 Local Government elections, we have applied the following apportionment across the State:



For individual local Governments the exact apportionment of costs may differ slightly from the above, as the cost categories are determined by applying the following variables:

- Envelopes, Printing and Postage, and WAEC Costs are determined by the number of electors in your Local Government;
- Processing and Results is determined by the expected response rate for your election; and
- Returning Officer Costs are determined by the complexity of the election for the Returning Officer; we classify Local Governments into bands depending on a number of factors including number of Wards, number of vacancies and the number of candidates, and then we pay our Returning Officers a rate which reflects this band.

Estimated Cost of 2025 Local Government Elections

The Commission estimates that the total cost of conducting the Local Government Elections across Western Australia in 2025 will increase by \$1.3 million, compared to 2023. The key drivers for this cost increase are as follows:

- a 45% cost increase from Australia Post, comprising of a 25% increase which came into effect in March 2024, and an additional 20% proposed increase currently being considered by the Australian Competition and Consumer Commission, which if approved will take effect in July 2025; and
- a 9% increase in the salaries paid to Returning Officers as required by the Public Sector CSA Agreement 2024.

Variations to the final costs for your Council

In accordance with the *Local Government (Elections) Regulations 1997*, the Commission conducts elections on the basis of full accrual cost recovery. This means that should the actual costs incurred to conduct the election be less or greater than what we have estimated, the final cost may differ from the cost estimate you have been provided.

Whilst we aim to keep additional costs at a minimum wherever possible, the following are examples of where cost increases may arise:

- If a Returning Officer is selected that is not local to your area;
- If you elect for Australia Post Priority Service for the lodgement of your election package;
- If casual staff are required for the issuing of Replacement Election Packages;
- If casual staff are required to assist the Returning Officer on election day or night; or
- Unanticipated cost increases from our suppliers.

We will endeavour to keep you informed of any unanticipated cost increases as they are incurred during the election.

Service Commitment

The Commission is committed to conducting elections impartially, effectively, efficiently and professionally. Following each election event, we review our performance and identify ways to improve our service delivery.

The Commission acknowledges that during the 2023 Local Government Ordinary Elections, the results for many Local Governments were delayed. Since this time we have improved our Count Processes, and as demonstrated through extraordinary elections conducted in 2024, we are now able to finalise our results more quickly whilst still retaining accuracy and integrity.

If you have any suggestions for improvements we can make to deliver your election, your feedback is welcome at all times.

Next Steps

Should you wish to accept this cost estimate and proceed with the Electoral Commission undertaking this election, there are specific steps that must be taken under the *Local Government Act 1995*. These steps are summarised in the attached flow chart (Attachment A).

As outlined in the flow chart, if you accept this Cost Estimate then please advise of us this in writing, so that we can issue a Written Agreement letter. Both the Cost Estimate letter, and the Written Agreement letter then need to be taken to Council for a decision.

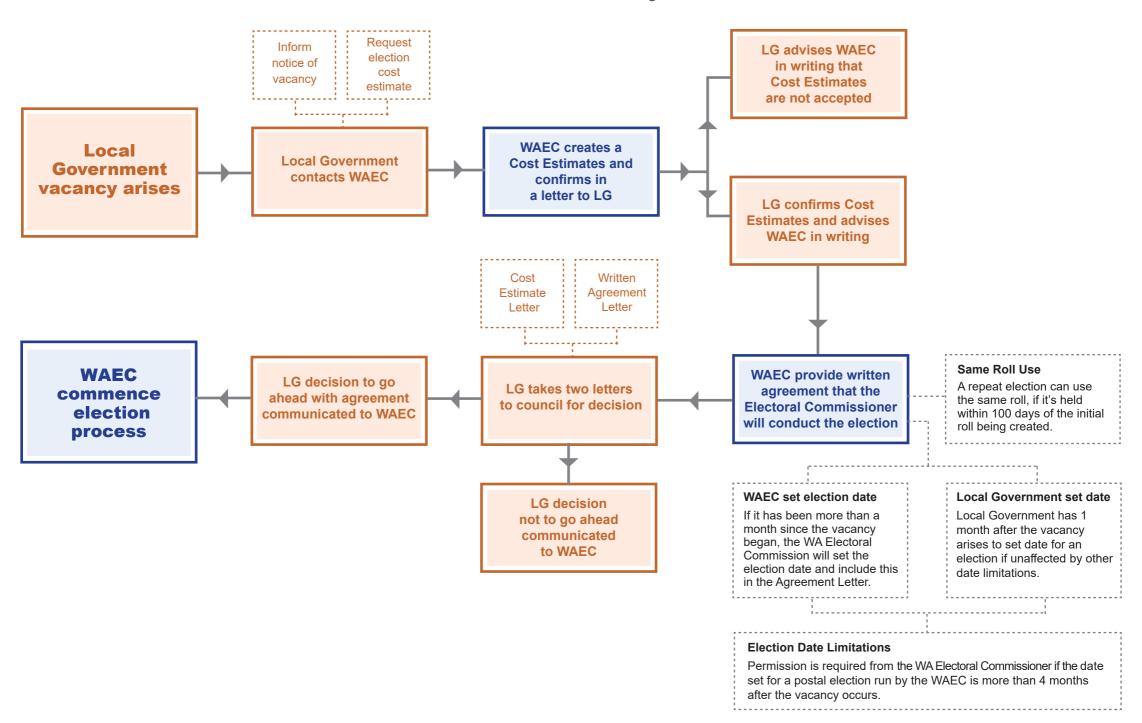

Re: Support for Early Years' Program - Kondinin Primary School

Over the past six years, a successful Early Years'/ Better Beginnings program has been run for two and a half hours per week at Kondinin Primary school. Each session attracts between 5 and 15 children, ranging in age from a few months to 4 years old. This program has been made possible through a collaboration between the Shire of Kondinin, the Kondinin Community Resource Centre, and the Kondinin Primary School. Through this arrangement, the school provides the venue, and the CRC and Shire contribute financially to the program by paying for three hours per week so a qualified Early Childhood teacher can run the program. The CRC funds three days per month of Early Years (75%), and the Shire contributes the remaining 25%, the latter being part of the State Library's Better Beginnings Program (run one day per month).

The Early Years' Program has a number of key goals including breaking down the barriers between the school and the community as well as ensuring that young parents see Kondinin Primary School as a viable choice for their school aged children. With school buses travelling out of town, it is important to market our fabulous school to the local community to reduce the perception that neighbouring schools are better. The Early Years program also provides social connection for young parents, especially those who are new to town.

Each Early Years' session consists of free play, story and singing time, an art/craft activity, and morning tea. A directed activity is set up each week to encourage learning and development of important skills. In addition, the children participate in some school events such as Bike Month and National Science Week, and also use the school playground, which helps with the transition to formal schooling. The Better Beginnings Program has a greater focus on singing and book reading. This program supports families to read, talk, sing, write and play every day through long-standing partnerships with public libraries, schools and other community organisations.

Previously the school has provided \$1000 per year for resources and fruit. This was part of a one-off grant to set up the Early Years' program, however the principal has informed us that this money has been expended. Whilst the school values the program and is able continue to provide the venue each week, it is unable to contribute further funds towards the program as this is contrary to Department of Education policy. As a result, the CRC request that the Shire contribute \$1000 per year for the fruit and resources needed to run the Early Years' Program. We would be extremely grateful if this could be included in the next Shire of Kondinin budget. If in agreement with our request, the CRC would invoice the Shire, up to \$1000 annually, depending on the previous year's expenditure.

The CRC would be more than happy to provide more information if needed. Thank you for considering our request.
