1 BASIS OF PREPARATION AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF PREPARATION

The financial report comprises general purpose financial statements which have been prepared in accordance with the *Local Government Act 1995* and accompanying regulations.

Local Government Act 1995 requirements

Section 6.4(2) of the *Local Government Act 1995* read with the *Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996* prescribe that the financial report be prepared in accordance with the *Local Government Act 1995* and, to the extent that they are not inconsistent with the Act, the Australian Accounting Standards. The Australian Accounting Standards (as they apply to local governments and not-for-profit entities) and Interpretations of the Australian Accounting Standards Board were applied where no inconsistencies exist.

The *Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996* specify that vested land is a right-of-use asset to be measured at cost, and is considered a zero cost concessionary lease. All right-of-use assets under zero cost concessionary leases are measured at zero cost rather than at fair value, except for vested improvements on concessionary land leases such as roads, buildings or other infrastructure which continue to be reported at fair value, as opposed to the vested land which is measured at zero cost. The measurement of vested improvements at fair value is a departure from AASB 16 which would have required the Shire to measure any vested improvements at zero cost. Accounting policies which have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report have been consistently applied unless stated otherwise. Except for cash flow and rate setting information, the financial report has been prepared on the accrual basis and is based on historical costs, modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and liabilities.

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT REPORTING ENTITY

All funds through which the Shire controls resources to carry on its functions have been included in the financial statements forming part of this financial report.

All monies held in the Trust Fund are excluded from the financial statements.

Judgements and estimates

The preparation of a financial report in conformity with Australian Accounting Standards requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that effect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets and liabilities, income and expenses.

The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The balances, transactions and disclosures impacted by accounting estimates are as follows:

- * estimated fair value of certain financial assets
- * impairment of financial assets
- * estimation fair values of land and buildings, infrastructure and investment property
- * estimation of uncertainties made in relation to lease accounting
- * estimated useful life of intangible assets

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Significant accounting policies utilised in the preparation of these statements are as described within the 2025-26 Annual Budget. Please refer to the adopted budget document for details of these policies.

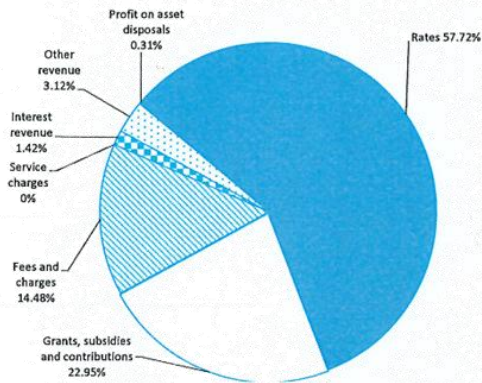

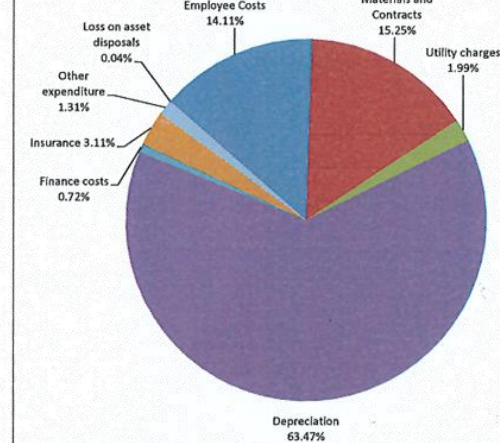

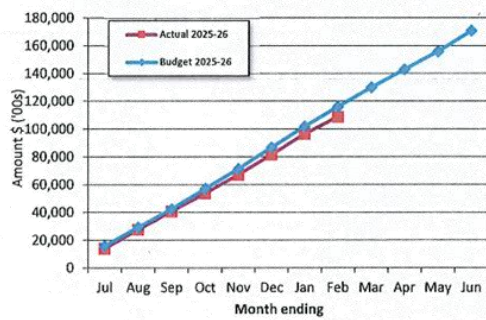
Operating Revenue



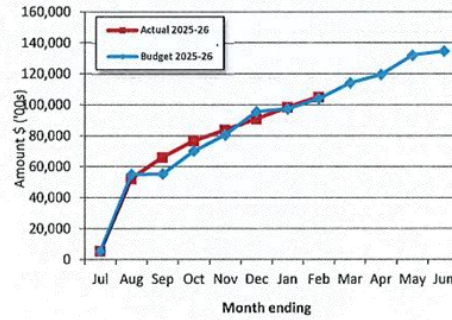
Operating Expenditure



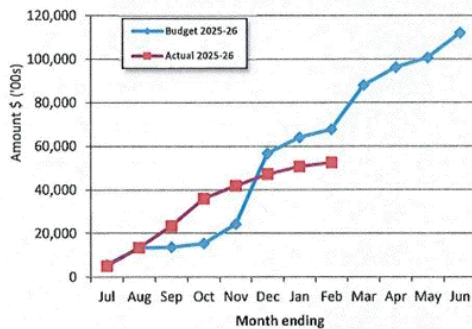
Budget Operating Expenses -v- YTD Actual



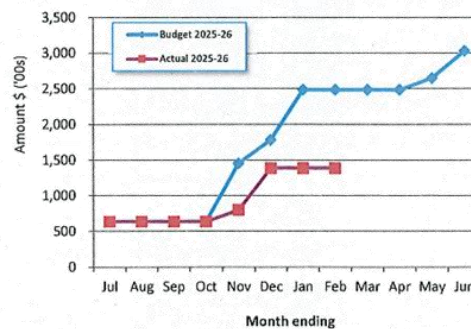
Budget Operating Revenues -v- YTD Actual

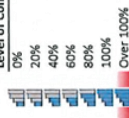

Provisions are measure using the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

Employee Related Provisions

Short-term employee benefits

Provision is made for the Shire's obligations for short-term employee benefits. Short-term employee benefits are benefits (other than termination benefits) that are expected to be settled wholly before 12 months after the end of the annual reporting period in which the employees render the related service, including wages, salaries and sick leave.

Short-term employee benefits are measured at the (undiscounted) amounts expected to be paid when the obligation is settled.

The Shire's obligations for short-term employee benefits such as wages, salaries and sick leave are recognised as part of the current trade and other payables in the calculation of net current assets.

Other long-term employee benefits

The Shire's obligations for employees annual leave and long service leave entitlements are recognised as employee related provisions in the statement of financial position.

Long-term employee benefits are measured at the present value of the expected future payments to be made to employees. Expected future payments incorporate anticipate future wage and salary levels, durations of service and employee departures and are discounted at rates determined by reference to market yields at the end of the reporting period on government bonds that have maturity dates that approximate the terms of the obligations.

Any remeasurements for changes in assumptions of obligations for other long-term employee benefits are presented as non-current provisions in its statement of financial position, except where the Shire does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least 12 months after the end of the reporting period, in which case the obligations are presented as current provisions.

Contract liabilities

An entities obligations to transfer goods or services to a customer for which the entity has received consideration (or the amount is due) from the customer.

Capital grant/contribution liabilities

Grants to acquire or construct recognisable non-financial assets to identified specifications be constructed to be controlled by the Shire are recognised as a liability until such time as the Shire satisfies its obligations under the agreement.

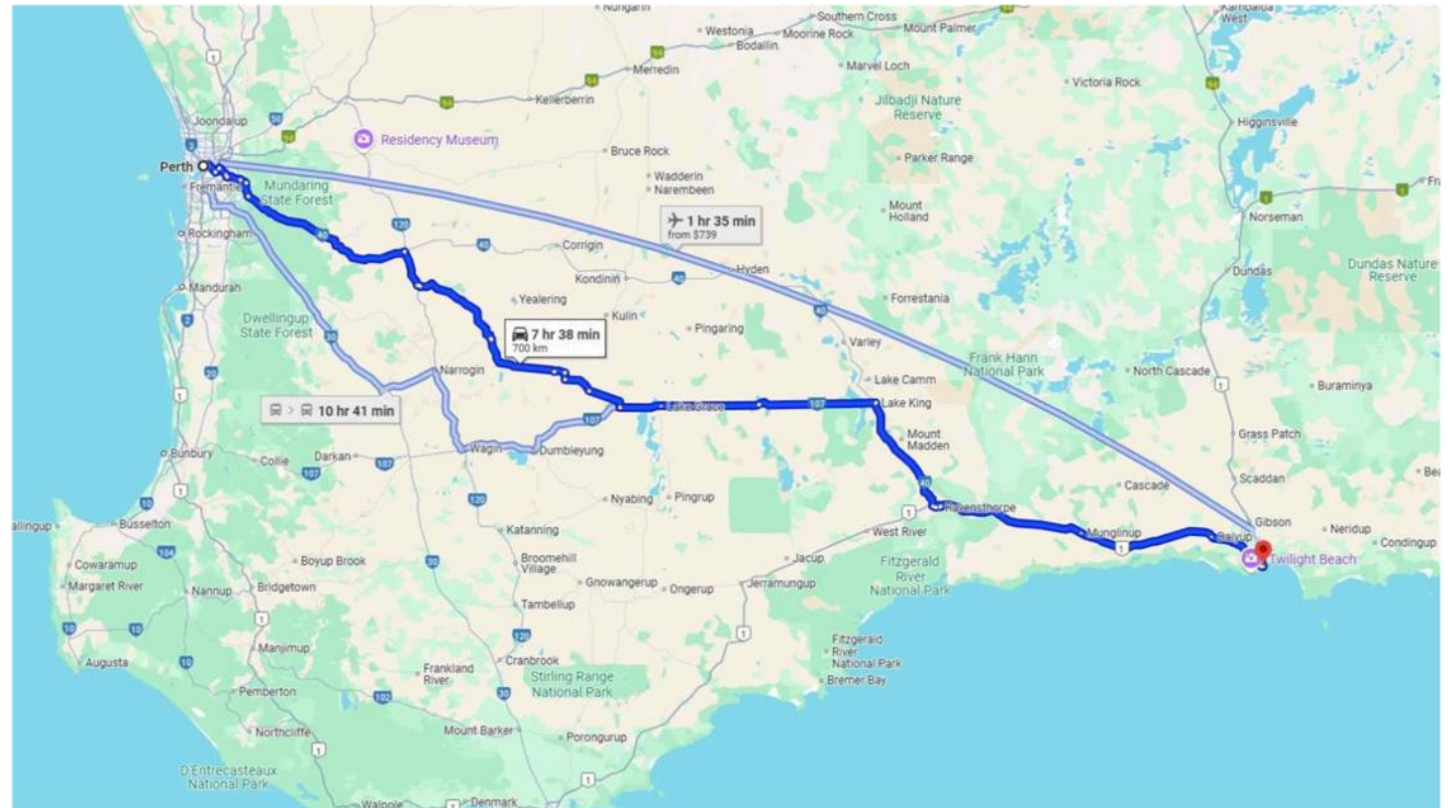

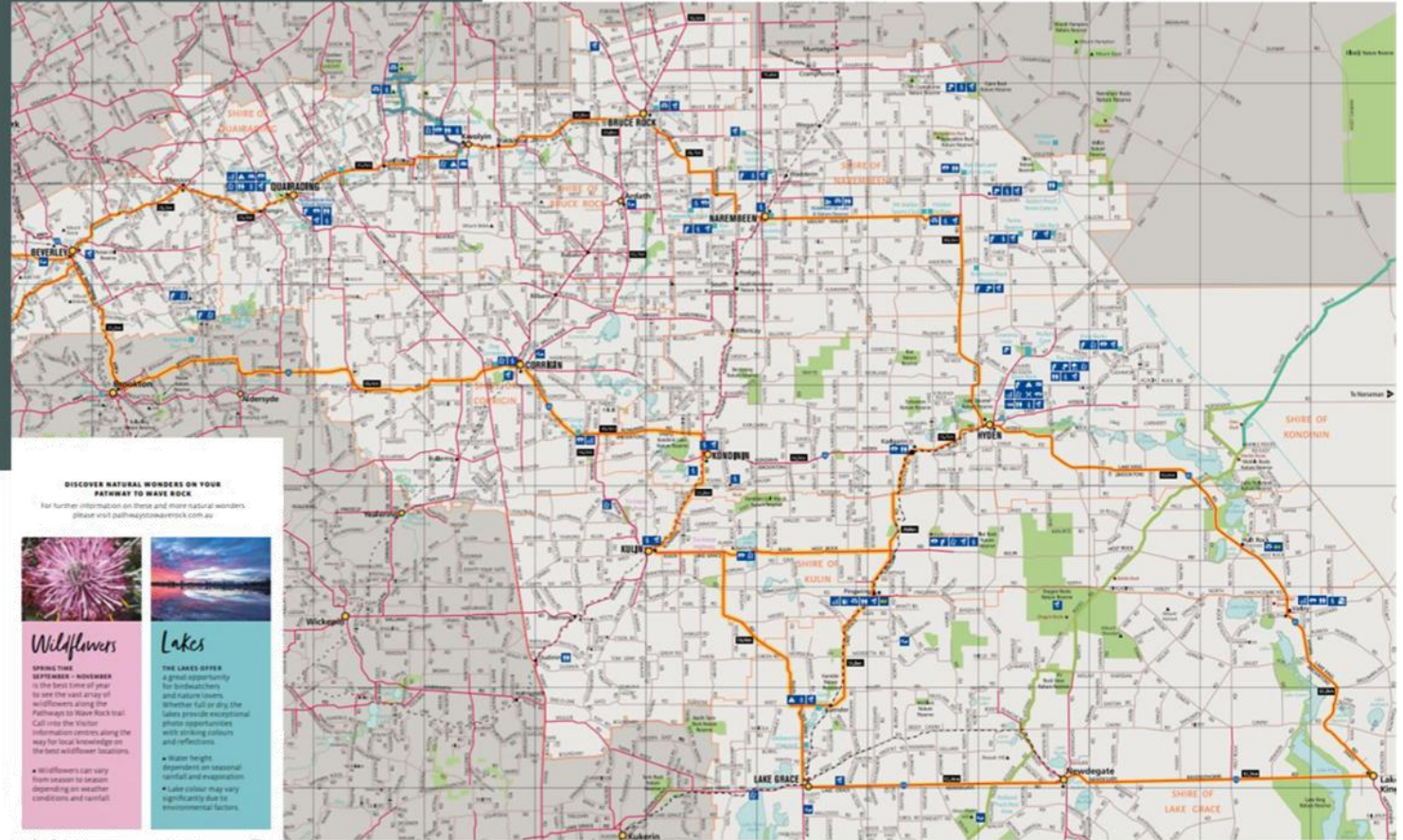

Objective:

The Shire of Kondinin recognises the important role community organisations play in fostering social connection, participation, and wellbeing.

The objective of this policy is to:

- Support community-led initiatives that strengthen participation, wellbeing and social cohesion within the Shire of Kondinin
- Ensure fair access to funding through defined eligibility and assessment criteria
- Provide a structured procedure for managing ad-hoc funding requests received throughout the year
- Safeguard public funds by ensuring all requests are assessed against adopted budget allocations and governance requirements
- Reduce administrative burden while maintaining responsible financial management.

Scope:

The Community Chest Fund provides small-scale, flexible financial and in-kind assistance to support grassroots initiatives that benefit the Kondinin community.

This policy establishes a clear, consistent, and transparent framework for assessing and administering Community Chest funding.

Council will allocate an annual budget to the Community Chest Fund as part of the annual budget process.

Funding limits are as follows:

- Up to \$500 cash contribution per application
- Up to \$500 in-kind or fee waiver support per application

- A maximum combined total of \$500 (cash and/or in-kind) per organisation **per financial year**.

In-kind assistance will be calculated using the Shire's standard internal costings for staff time, plant hire, or facility hire.

The fund will be open twice annually. Once in March / April and once in November / December.

Policy Guidelines:

1. Eligibility

1.1 Eligible Applicants

The Community Chest Fund is available to not-for-profit organisations operating within, or clearly servicing, the Shire of Kondinin.

Where an organisation is not based within the Shire of Kondinin or operates across multiple Local Government Areas, applications may be referred to Council for consideration.

Eligible applicants include:

- Incorporated not-for-profit organisations (e.g. clubs, associations, community groups).
- Unincorporated not-for-profit organisations applying through an incorporated auspice body.
- Local schools, where the proposed activity delivers a clear benefit to the broader community

Applicants must:

- Demonstrate that their activities benefit the Shire of Kondinin community
- Have no outstanding acquittals, debts, or compliance matters with the Shire
- Hold appropriate public liability insurance, where applicable.

1.2 Ineligible Applicants

The following are not eligible to apply:

- Commercial for-profit organisations
- Government agencies
- Unincorporated organisations without an auspice arrangement
- Organisations with outstanding acquittals under any Shire funding program.

1.3 Eligible Activities

The Community Chest Fund may support small-scale projects, activities, and operational needs that deliver a clear community benefit. This may include:

- Promotion and advertising of local community events
- Essential minor equipment purchases required for ongoing operations
- Workshops, programs, or initiatives that strengthen community participation
- Costs associated with delivering public events
- Minor infrastructure improvements on community or Shire-managed land, subject to relevant approvals
- Fee waivers for eligible Shire facilities
- In-kind assistance, such as staff time, plant, or equipment, where resources are available.

Infrastructure works must comply with statutory and Shire approval requirements and must not create ongoing maintenance or financial liability for the Shire unless otherwise approved.

1.4 Ineligible Activities

The Community Chest Fund will not provide assistance for:

- Ongoing operational expenses such as wages, utilities, rent, insurance, or general administration
- Alcohol
- Retrospective projects or purchases
- Projects that primarily benefit an individual
- Subsidies for sporting club membership or participation fees
- Assistance towards Council rates or standard user agreements
- Projects that do not demonstrate a clear benefit to the Shire of Kondinin community.

2. Application and Assessment Criteria

Application forms are available online or at the Shire Offices (Kondinin and Hyden). Groups must use the designated application form to request funding.

Applications will be assessed against the following considerations:

- Demonstrated community benefit
- Alignment with the Shire's strategic objectives
- Organisational capacity to deliver the project or activity
- Value for money
- Level of community contribution (financial or in-kind).

Applications are generally assessed in order of receipt. Where demand exceeds available funds, priority may be given to collaborative projects or those demonstrating broader community impact.

2.1 Merit Assessment Process

Where the total value of eligible applications exceeds the remaining annual Community Chest allocation, applications will be subject to a structured merit assessment process.

Eligible applications will be assessed by an internal panel comprising a minimum of two (2) and a maximum of three (3) Shire officers.

Panel members must declare any actual or perceived conflicts of interest prior to assessment.

Applications will be assessed against the following weighted criteria:

- Demonstrated community benefit
- Alignment with the Shire's strategic objectives
- Organisational capacity to deliver the project or activity
- Value for money
- Level of community contribution (financial or in-kind).

Each application will be scored against the adopted assessment matrix and ranked in order of total score.

Funding will be allocated to the highest ranked applications until the available budget is exhausted. Council may determine to partially fund an application where appropriate.

A written record of panel assessments and scoring will be retained for governance and audit purposes.

3. Approval and Delegation

The Chief Executive Officer is delegated to approve payments from the municipal fund, including Community Chest Fund allocations, subject to annual budget limitations. The Chief Executive Officer may approve funding requests within the allocated budget and policy guidelines. Requests exceeding budget limits or policy parameters will be referred to Council for determination.

A summary of Community Chest allocations will be compiled and reported to Council periodically for transparency and oversight.

4. Conflict of Interest

Applicants must disclose any actual or perceived conflicts of interest in their submission.

Elected Members and Shire staff are required to declare and manage conflicts of interest in accordance with:

- The Local Government Act 1995
- Associated regulations
- The Shire's Code of Conduct.

5. Application Process

Applications must:

- Be submitted on the approved Community Chest Fund application form
- Include all required supporting documentation.

Incomplete applications will not be assessed until all required information is provided.

Applications may be submitted during the two advertised funding periods per year while funds remain available.

Applicants will be notified in writing of the outcome. Approved projects must be completed within the same financial year unless an extension is approved by the Chief Executive Officer.

6. Payment and Acquittal

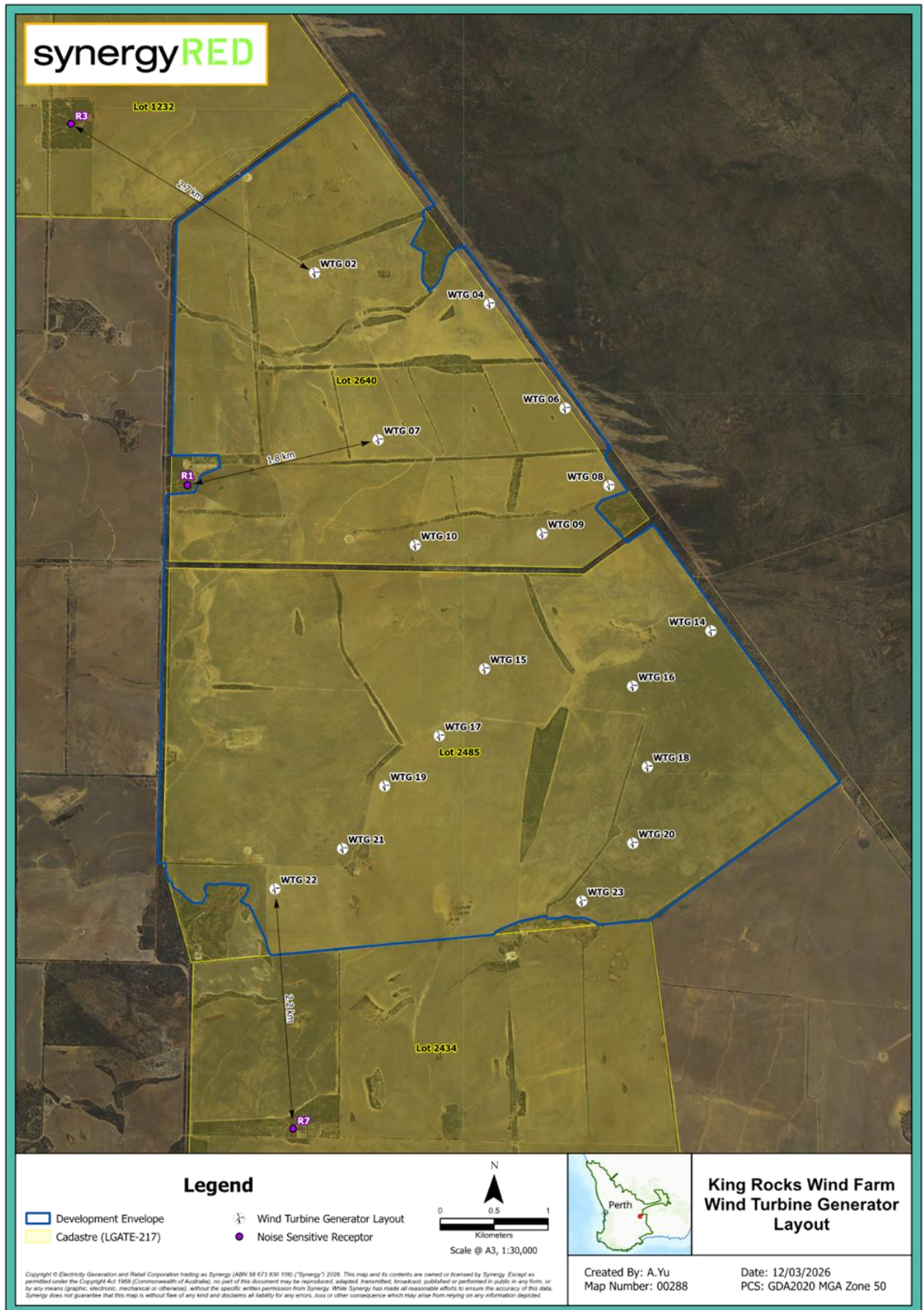
Approved applicants will be required to submit an invoice for the approved funding amount. Payment will be made by the Shire following receipt of the invoice and completion of internal administrative processes.

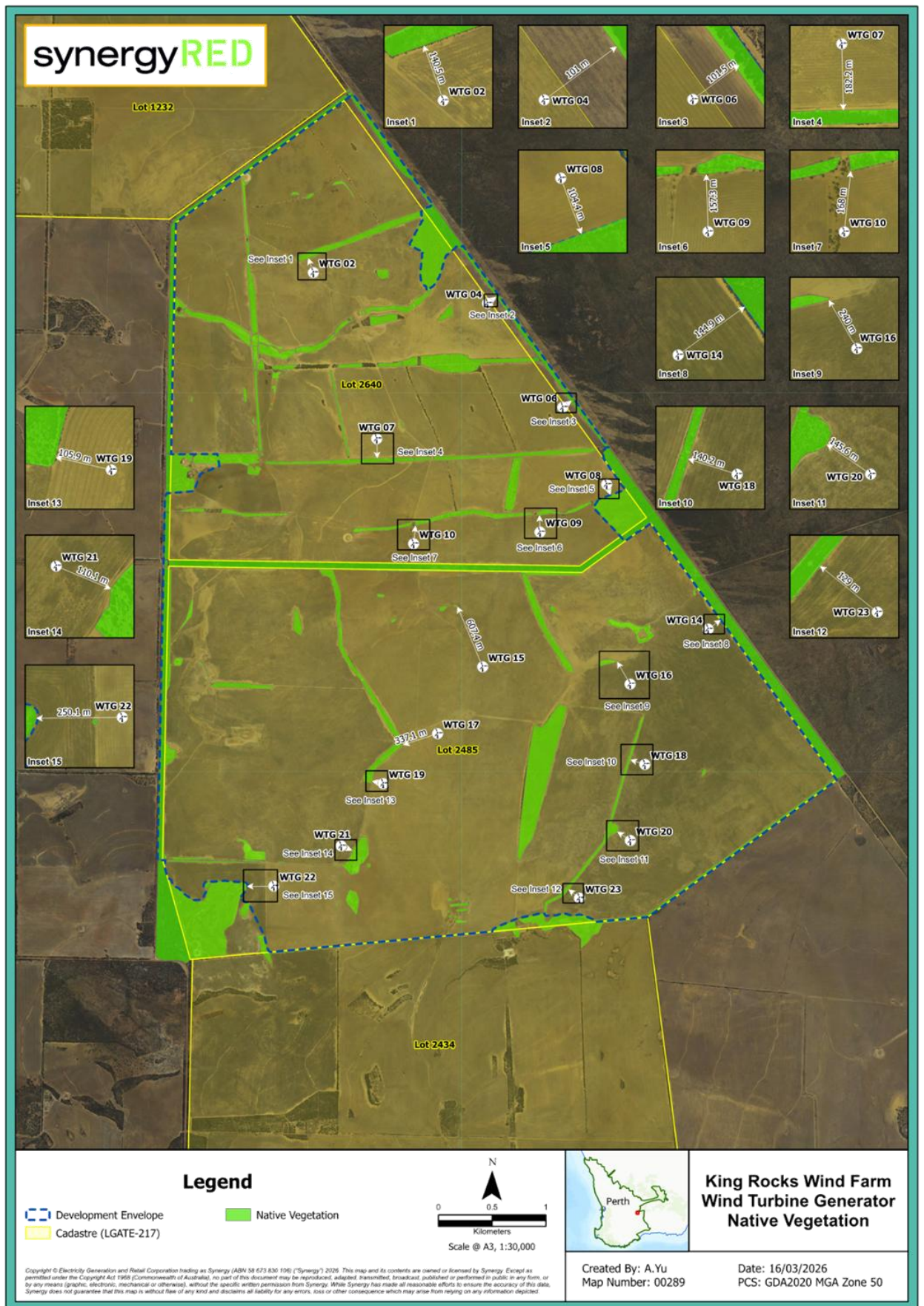
Where support is provided through fee waivers or in-kind assistance (such as facility hire, staff time, plant, or equipment), no invoice will be required, and the support will be administered directly through Shire processes.

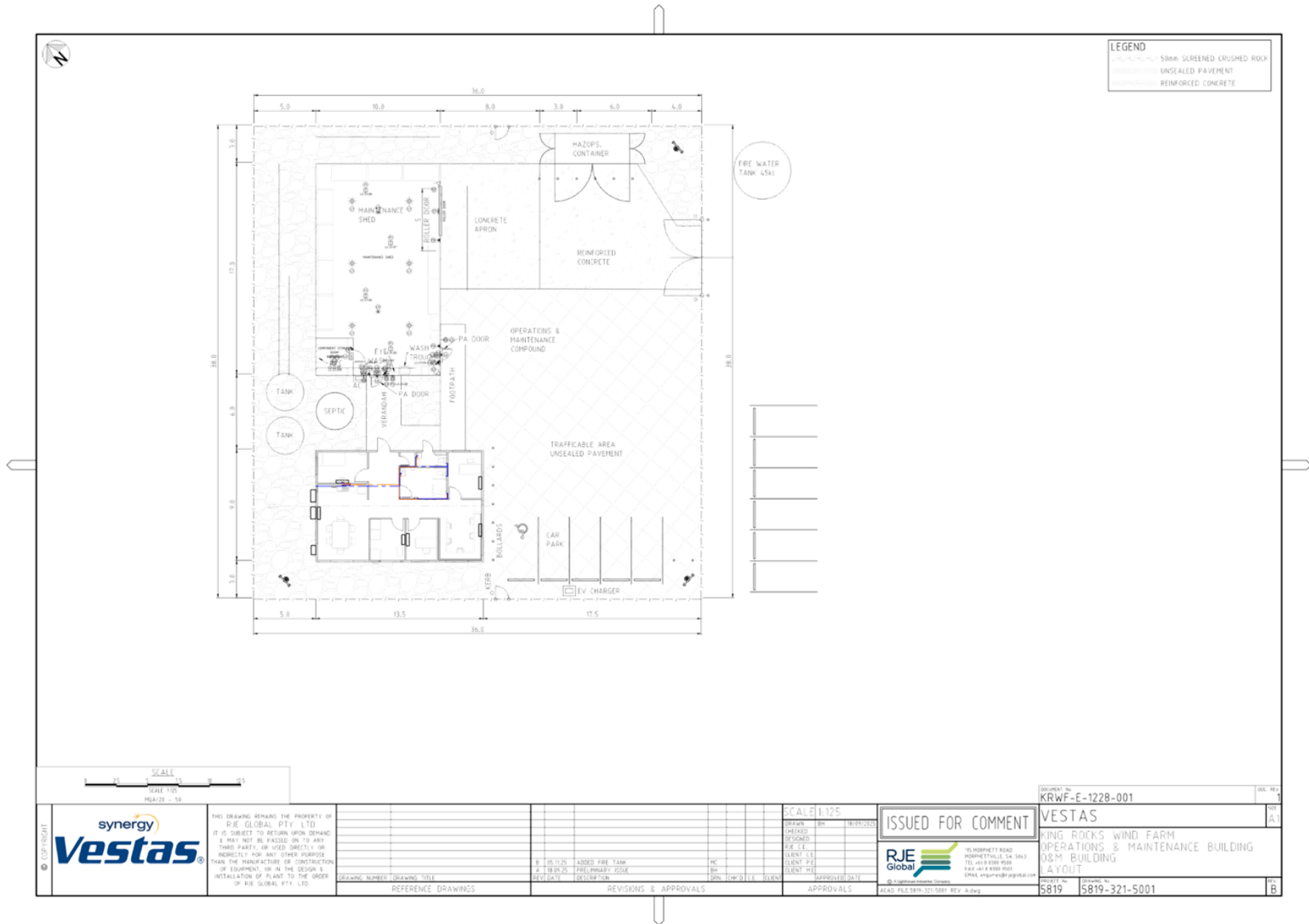
A brief acquittal must be submitted within eight (8) weeks of completion of the project or activity and must include:

- A summary of outcomes achieved
- Evidence acknowledging the Shire's support (e.g. photographs, event promotion or social media posts)
- Evidence of expenditure where applicable.

Failure to submit an acquittal within the required timeframe will result in ineligibility for future funding and recovery of funds where appropriate.

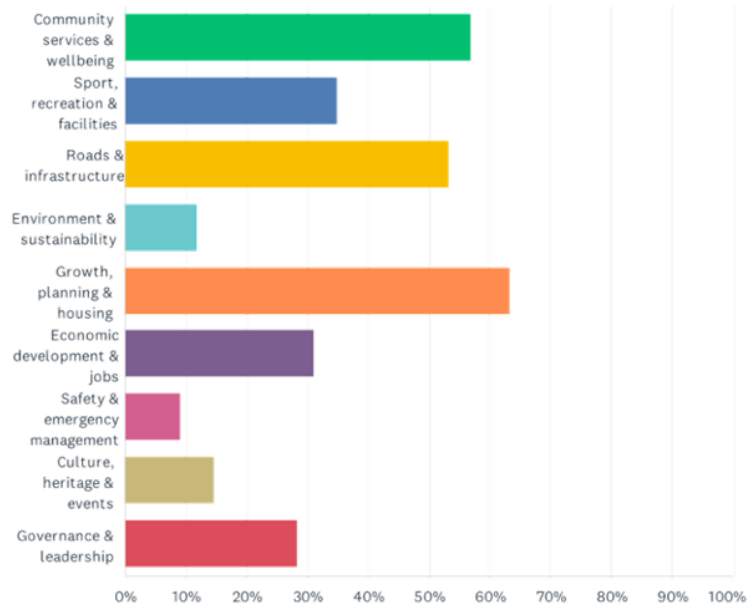

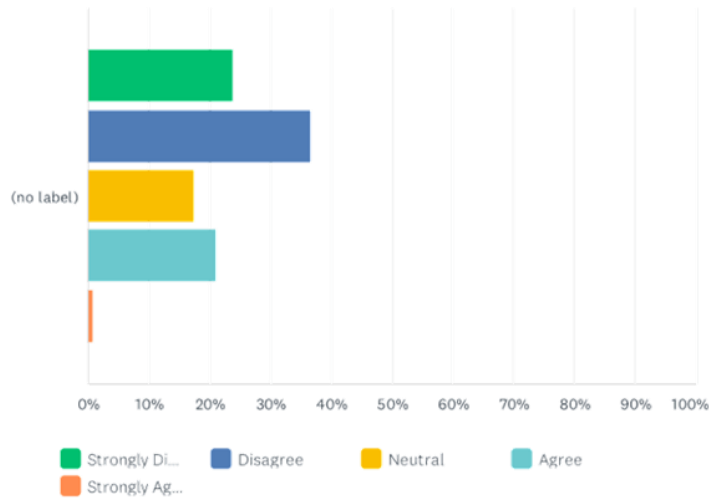

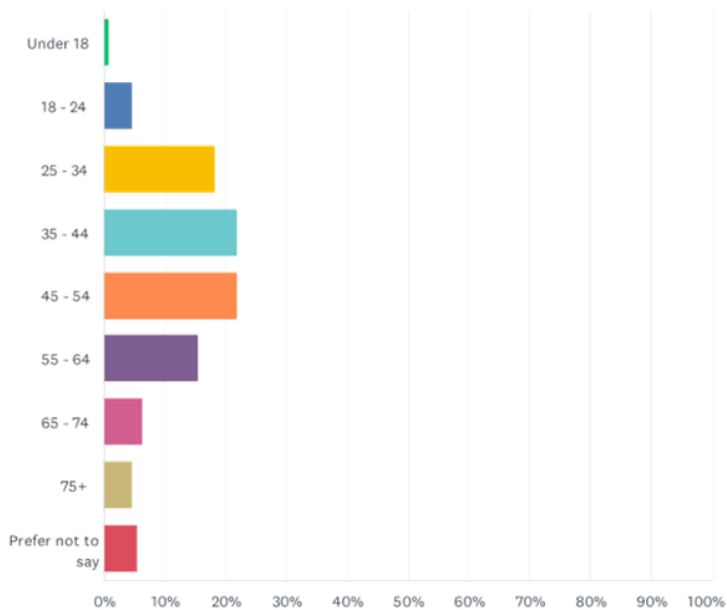

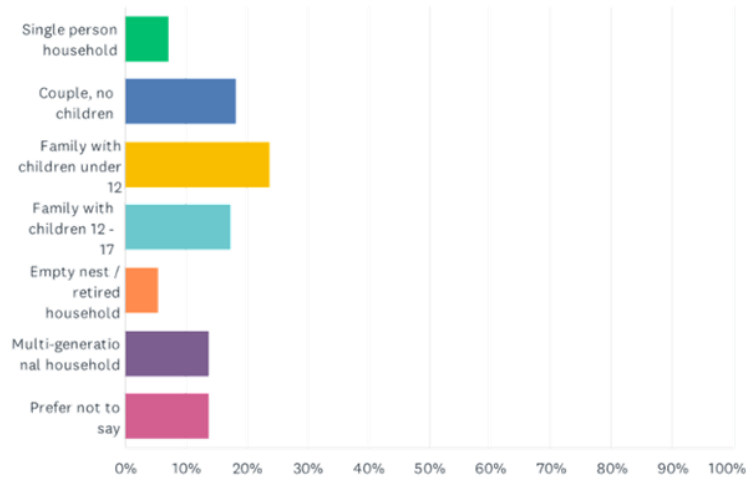

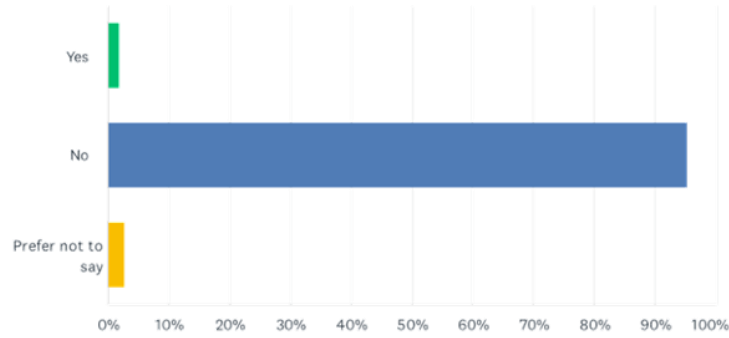

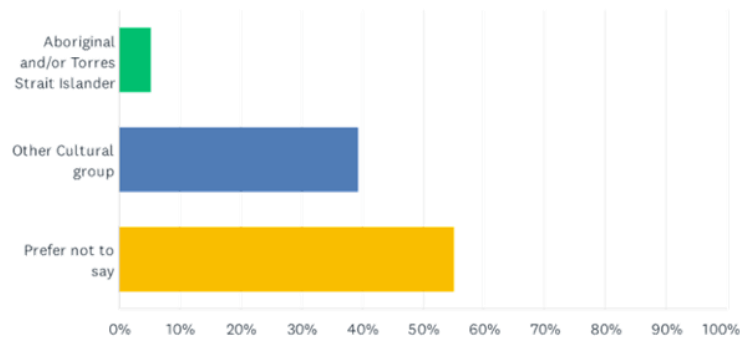

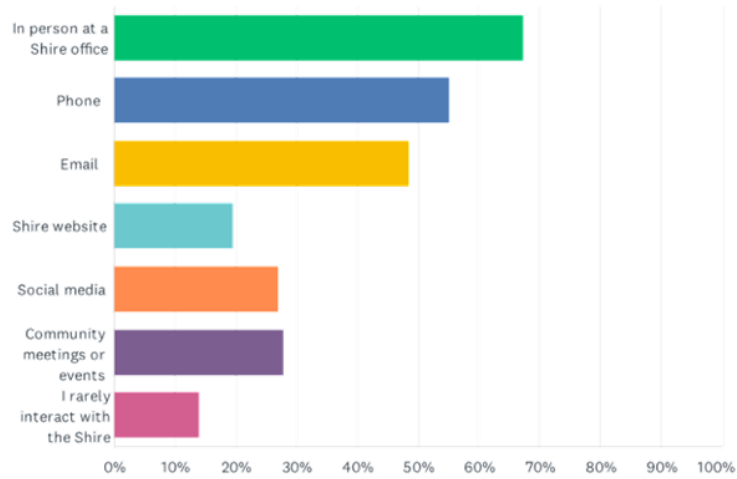

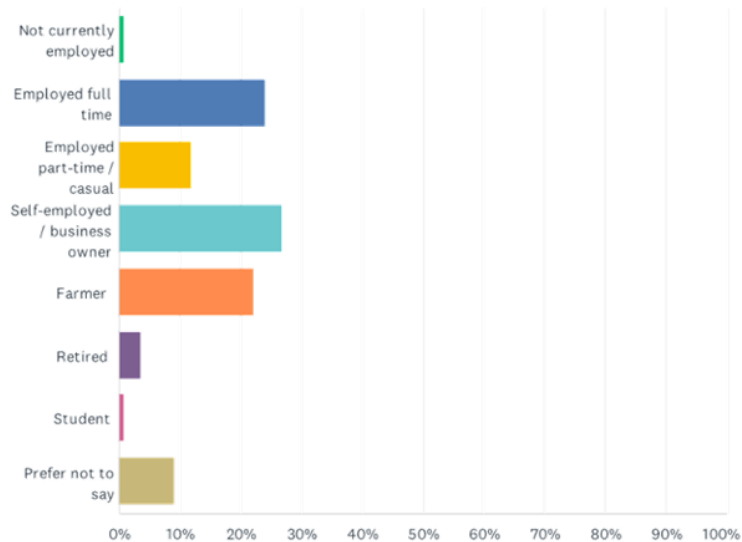

Responses that did not relate to the survey questions or did not provide constructive or relevant feedback have also been omitted.

Q1. Shire services support the wellbeing of people at all life stages
Unfortunately Yerrakine Lodge has become a white elephant.
I think there could be better facilities for young kids and families in Hyden
We agree The Shire need to step in where normal commercial arrangements fail. i.e. When a Doctor or Child Health Nurse are not available in the normal course of services in the Shire . The Shire need to step in to facilitate and meet that need. Seeking the help of the State Government to assist with those services.
They try. Very hard with small budget
More could be done for older people, eg organising things likegutter cleaning,window cleaning. Care facilitators dont have staff to do the above.
there isn't a general safe space for people in emotional need to find counseling
Kondinin has not much for community groups for young people which the only thing is sports when it's in season and older like the men shed which seems to be just for a couple of people
There is an absence of home care help for the elderly in town. No spaces for a youth group. Unless people and children engage in sporting activities there is a lack of other things to do.
Not sure if the aged care facility is fictional. Unaware of any strategic plan to grow the aged care facilities
I would like to see a gymnasium in town.
Elderly housing is done by progress in Hyden and more could be done by the shore maybe?
I feel that the shire has been forced into doing this because of the existing state and federal government policies. The shire is expected to do more than they have the funds for because of this situation.
We need more age care housing in our shire
The monthly Senior Lunches have been very well received and enjoyed, as is the Senior exercise classes, and it is hoped Kerry Green will continue to have Shire support for these activities. With most of our Youth away at boarding school, it is difficult to know what could be done for them, other than in the sporting field. Healthwise, the Livingstone Medical seems to be working towards offering a variety of services which is excellent.
thank you for clearing our rubbish, verge pick ups etc. the doctor ++++++ parks and grounds, roads. so I like what you are doing and hope this will continue.
Younger demographic - playground survey completed, but no action has been seen. Senior demographic - no access to Yeerakine Lodge for our seniors
The shire has no presence at east end of shire
I believe our shire needs to help build a good level of mental wellbeing through community spaces, programs, and education, helping residents connect and participate in activities that foster social connection and resilience.
Most of the shores money is being blown on projects that only benefit tourists
We need to make sure services are equally distributed across the whole shire. As the population ages it is apparent that the need of equitable service provision is met.

The pool is a great facility. But a playground/bike pump track like other shires would be fantastic as a meeting place for young mums and kids and entertainment for kids
Need better facilities for young families in Kondinin.
Lack of paths in residential areas
There are some negative and some positive aspects in all areas, I do believe we need to improve more on the aged care facilities and access to more services
No respite care in Hyden. Redevelopment of park constantly stalled.
Q2. Facilities and services are inclusive and accessible for all members of the community
These services should be accessible but Government Departments like the Education Department must be required to provide the school buses, classrooms and teachers in an efficient and cost effective manner. The Shire should not be required to use Rate payer money to fill in Government shortfalls in funding.
Disabled facilities available at most buildings
Would be good if Yeerakine Lodge was run and serviced by WACHS to make it more accessible to aged persons requiring greater care than what is provided at West Court.
Same as the first question
Not sure what facilities you are meaning. Sporting grounds, pool?
I think playground facilities could be improved significantly. Skate parks in both towns are dangerous and playgrounds could be greatly improved.
I don't like the heavy (? fire) door on the ladies toilets in Kondinin, behind the Shire building. Which could effect accessibility for frail aged, or suchlike. But generally, most things seem ok.
Although this has improved, there is still need for further development, including footpaths where younger families reside, and accessible toilets in the public toilets near the town hall.
The shire jst continues to build the shit town of Kondinin - noting in over 100 yrs the shire has no once built a building or facility in hyden. NEVER
Hyden needs some green spaces with colour and not in Coronation Park - one of these spaces should be up Smith Loop/Radbourne Drive area as this part of town is definitely neglected and forgotten, yet has many tourist each and every night.
This is developing slowly. Once again we need to provide services that reflect the needs . Hyden should have a bitumen airfield for the royal flying dr. Policy prevents considering the value of private involvement (land holding) and yet without the support of the landholders enabling the transfer station ECT the east end of the shire have 160 km to reach the western end. In times of emergencies this is too far. Shire should work on policy changes to consider including private holdings for the benefit of community. The accident last week was only one of many that have occurred 80 km east of Hyden.
Could be improved
Q3. The Shire works effectively with community and service organisations
Communication not always evident and consultation with diff groups could be improved,
Disability access in many areas is limited, considering the amount of mobile assisted people in this town
All the events such as the markets have always been great
I haven't seen any evidence of this.
This is a strength of the Shire.
There seems to be a good relationship with progress who do a lot around Hyden but maybe the Shire needs to lead more on some of these projects I think.
Putting a small flyer in the shore office is NOT enough communication for voting on important matters
Disgraceful Council management of the doctor engagement - it was a good structure and service. Worked well with neighbouring Shire, only to go to a monopoly provider.

I sometimes think that some community feedback and comments are ignored eg the choice of mural of wave rock on the back of building in hyden. I did not hear any local people comment they wanted that one. Most of us respect the aboriginal culture of being a taboo area. I personally think that some groups have incredibly high expectations and want too much
A fairly good relationship is held between the Shire and community and service organisations.
The Shire of Kondinin staff need to dress (uniform) & act professionally at all times. They need to be well informed of the whole Shire of Kondinin offerings not just those for the town they live in. They need to remain neutral and be pro active for the wider region.
Q4. Community wellbeing should remain a key priority of the Shire

Playgrounds are sub-standard for a tourist town like Hyden, more effort needs to be put into a new playground on the main street and an upgrade to the skate park. The pavilion and tennis clubs also desperately need upgrades. There is always a lot of talk but we never see any action.
Sport centre very dated and had multiple function issues in 2025 (eg toilets breaking)
money always spent in kondinin town

Parks and playgrounds are the bare minimum compared to surrounding towns. Also could do with a community gym
The recreation facilities are adequate but need upgrading and updating, they are tired and need modernising as well as the library needs to be more community friendly. A place for the community members to meet and engage with each other.
Enough has been spent in this area
We need a gym Pilates performers. I often travel to the Kulin gym that's a time consuming.
Overall the facilities are good in Hyden, Kondinin has recently had new buildings done which seem great but the Tennis club looks to be in need of improvement. Would also be nice to have fitness facilities available in the town.
Hyden rec centre needs up grades
One Day sport has changed the makeup of our Saturday sport. We lack changerooms and storage for the Hyden community
Both the HYDEN rec centre and HYDEN tennis club are both heavily used and require significant improvement
Hyden Rec Centre has been in the process of renovating for ~10yrs?
Quite heavily reliant on funding from the KCRC.
The upgrades to the Hyden recreation centre have been in the works now for the best part of 15 years and there doesn't seem to be an appetite to finish the job
Hyden rec centre hand tennis courts delayed again as always for buildings to be done in London in again
Tennis club in Hyden, building needs some attention. But it is an expensive and tricky one.
Hyden rec centre is very dated. No air con. Hyden public toilets are also very old and located in a terrible spot.
Kondini gets everything built new from shire. Hyden and Karlgarin have to rely on local effort to get any sort of facility. As such we are left with old shit buildings painted a different colour
As the populations dwindle in our towns, we need to be ruthless (due to economic reasons). We need to consider centralised hubs, designing buildings to be co-habitable (bowls, cricket, footy, hockey, netball, sporting functions, training seminars etc) which yes does mean the relocation of some sporting facilities, but a move that will use the facilities to the fullest.
Skate park old and dangerous no big parks for smaller kids available
There is nothing for the pre-teen/ teenage age groups in Kondinin. The skate park is outdated. The parks are not all ages/ all abilities. No gym equipment / gym. The Kondinin Pool doesn't have enough shade over the kids swimming area. There's no basketball court or even a cricket net for pre-teens/teenagers.
If anything there is too much being spent on this.
Some improvements could be made on sports buildings in Hyden, a 24 hr access gym would be great.
There are poor toilet facilities in Hyden. No mother's room ever been available to use. For a town with large numbers frequently going through this is dismal. The town hall toilets are a priority. Airconditioning should also be considered as the town hall is still used. Our library could do with an overhaul. Dewey system not used properly. Fiction and non fiction mixed on shelves. Better storage and resources. Start again and make it inviting. With older population many would still enjoy a good book. Large print items are handy.
Kondinin needs a gym to enable weight training - an essential exercise form for all ages.
Non sporting activities as well as sporting to be catered for
There is no toilets in a close proximity to the playgrounds. This is an issue with young children who leave it until the last minute
Re-centre (especially changerooms) and Tennis Club in Hyden need upgraded . One building to meet these needs would be ideal

A gym would be greatly beneficial to the community in kondinin . Many in kondinin working and living have to travel to kulin to use gym facilities.
Facilities in Hyden need significant improvement, especially with plumbing
Sport yes. Gym is a must in Hyden. Don't waste rates on sport centre. It's sufficient. Add cooling and heating to make more usable. Turn youth base into a swipe card gym.
There are more than enough fields and buildings to support all forms of sport. Maybe too much - Kondinin and Kulin are a combined team so half and half use
Q6. Community buildings and facilities are well maintained, clean and accessible
The Kondinin Cemetery has been slow over the years with improvements, however the completion of the entrance wall and signage has been a welcome addition tot he area, also the water tank being replaced with a smaller on. This fits in well and is also much appreciated by the community. There has been news around that the Shire intends to build toilet facilities at both Hyden and Kondinin in anticipation that this eventuates it would also be much appreciated by those who visit the area, thus saving portable toilets being brought the area prior to a funeral.
Building upgrades are not always completed or take way too long to achieve
the standard could be higher
Public Toilet's outside the hall need to be upgraded.
Karlgarin Sports Pavilion is a poor condition.
I don't see many places in town that are dirty or unclean.
The emphasis is definite on sport in this town. So, the facilities are good. The aquatic centre is top notch. The beautiful heritage buildings opposite the shire offices are not. They are a feature of the town and falling down which is very sad to see. The toilet block, caravan park are all well maintained. The absence of any other building in town stops other activities like a youth group from having a place to be held.
The Hyden hall isn't always clean and tidy
The interior of the West Buildings require maintenance including painting.
Sometimes it seems repairs that are needed don't get communicated very well or actioned when communicated between sports organisations and the Shire, but unsure who is to blame here.

Turf is breaking down. Ropes will need replacing at some stage. Upgrades to the area could be undertaken as part of the shires responsibility to the community.

Q9. Investment in community facilities should be a priority
I still think a shower & toilet block should be built at the railway block. Many trucks & caravans park there because of the space and the tourist attractions. It is on the main road and plenty of room. The sealing of that section has made it look amazing.
The community are the rate payers, and while tourism is defiantly something we need to capitalise on, the rate payers should be top priority. We are choosing to live in this town, use our money to keep us here.
How are we not able to spend more money on our towns when we get that much tourism through for Wave Rock??
Roads and communications are more important. The focus in recent years has been on the facilitation concentrated in the towns. The needs of the major rate payers such as farmers and miners take second place to those in town, that's unfair. The election system favours those who contribute the least in rates to the Shire.

Very ugly in fact. Businesses in town have been allowed to fill their properties with junk. Old tyres, old car bodies, rubbish piled high. Standpipes - how much did it cost to put all the electric electronic shit on, and how much does it cost to maintain - against revenue received?
I don't use these so cannot comment. However how is rain meant to flow into drains when streets are filled with dirt (the sweeper has not moved it) or the drains are full of debris.

Q12. Footpaths, cycleways and trails support safety and connectivity
People towing caravans have said that the Wave Rock Road is very narrow with shrubs scraping vans if there are 2 going in opposite directions together.
Residents in the 'housing only' area in Kondinin have no option but use the road as a footpath/pram way as there no paths or usable verge.
Footpath is required along Stubbs Street - this street connects the Repacholi Pde area people to the rest of the town, often mums and dads with prams and small children on bikes are forced to use the road, with other traffic, which in dangerous and preventable with a footpath
The area over the railway line could be a problem, although the Shire has mowed the dry grass on the old oval etc and done a good job under the circumstances some of the land owners further out keep their blocks tidy and the grass mowed down. Others are just nothing but rubbish dumps with several blocks being like this for may years and a fire hazard. Although I believe two of these blocks are part of an estate, which may be a problem, but these blocks have been this way for fifty years that I know of. The block near the Hyden/Kondinin Road has had signs painted roughly on galvanised iron and the words on these signs are questionable. A good tidy up, car bodies removed would be acceptable.

Q14. Streetscapes, trees and public spaces are well managed
Would like a bit more colour in having flower beds and flowering shrubs. Bougainvillea don't need much water once established.

They are maintained well, granted Dave does a great job. However there is little to no landscaping in the town. Its all dirt and gum trees which is not appealing to visitors or local families. When I first moved here over 10 years ago, I could not get over how 'barron' the town of Hyden looked.
Only interesting items the locals have built and donated in Hyden
Our town always looks neat and tidy big effort from our groundskeeper
Hyden Town groundskeeper needs more support
More needs to be done in this area
Our main street should have more 'street appeal', things like community/town Christmas decorations, banners on the main street to advertise events etc or a light up bill board type board, our town is behind with these things, we need to take more pride in our main street, especially with the number of tourists that drive through daily.

The entrances to town could be improved.

Hyden as a tourist town, needs to be kept clean and tidy, and whilst our current town man Dave, does an amazing job, he should be given far more support in this regard. As a local, he is well placed to know what needs to be done, but an extra pair of hands would be most appreciated.
Would have preferred trees to have remained on verges - many removed years ago.
While hyden has a wonderful gardener in Dave Symcox he needs more support
Always weeds on entrance to hyden
One gardener in each town is not enough to manage the streetscapes etc. Hyden does look nice and neat and tidy as you drive through town, but Kondinin does not. I understand many of the unkept areas are not shire owned, but the impression as you drive into and around the town is not very inviting. Declan does an amazing job, but he is one person, and it is not fair to expect him to keep a high standard in every area of town.

It is essential that an asbestos disposal is maintained to facilitate the removal and burying of these type of noxious materials. More bins required in recycling facility in Hyden. Many times full. Old fencing wire facilities need to be established to enable their proper disposal.

We need more action on getting rid of the White Cockatoos before they decimate our trees. Perhaps more community members to shoot them.
Better management of roadside weeds is needed
Weed and mozzie control are not sufficient
well enough
Individuals in Hyden have been allowed to manage their own waste water management which is now impacting on the surrounding environment. The Shire has to be responsible for this, which the ratepayers have to pay for. Individuals need to be made responsible for their actions.

Not shires responsibility . Sounds like more costs on ratepayers
However, I have heard that a environmental issue reported was swept under the carpet, this should not be the case, no matter how small or big the issue is
I dont really care either way. Personally clearing trees should be allowed
Reserves in the shire need to be better maintained, we have some very rare orchids in the Reserve near Hyden tip, but people continually dump rubbish if the Tip is closed.
I have not seen the shire share or advertised anything they are doing around environmental management and improvement. I would like to see more work
No recycle bins at tip. Everything should be in one location. Some tip staff need to be more proactive in tidying up blowing rubbish rather than sitting in their cars.
Q17. Waste and recycling services meet expectations
Could we have a fence at the back of the recycled bins so rubbish doesn't fly all over the place up in the Industrial area.
I do not get my rubbish collected, however appreciate we are able to take it to the tip, free of charge
Amazing to have the 10c recycling located outside Elders Hyden. This is a huge bonus

Could have larger items eg fridges pick up more often or provide the service if you ring the shire.
Recycling at Shire Tip is non-existent
We lodged an application at the Hyden office in July of 2025 for a waste and recycling bins in preparation for the completion of our house, followed this up with emails on the 31/10/25 as the house was completed. We came back home over the Xmas/NY break and still no bins had been delivered, spoke to Avon waste as your office was closed and they informed us no request for a new service had been logged with them. Spoke to Avon waste 5/2/26 still no request for a new service. 5/2/26 spoke to the shire office, hopefully this will now be sorted.
However, it is problematic that glass (eg jars, large bottles etc) cannot be recycled unless it is part of the Containers for Change initiative.
Don't use the very often so don't know.
The Hyden Recycling area is a mess, though some members of the community seem to use it as their personal dumping ground, and take little care. Eg. boxes of items just dumped by bins, and filling bins with boxes instead of using the cardboard bin. Thank goodness it is out of sight of tourists, after the disgraceful decision to have it placed in the main street quite a number of years ago. Perhaps it needs a cyclone fence around it to stop the wind blowing the rubbish through the bush, though how the Recycling truck accesses this area might prove problematic. Probably a three sided cyclone fence may result in less rubbish being blown around.
Waste transfer stations need improved gravel roads and a tidy up
Does it? We are told that all recycling is buried in a hole
There are no recycling facilities
All the recycling goes in same skip bins. Needs proper recycling.
Really good. far better than eg the city. Scip bin hire, when you need it is very helpful.

Q20. I feel safe in my community
And lets keep it that way
No secret there is a drug abuse issue around town. This can sometimes make me feel uneasy and nervous when it is known there is users around town. I dont think out local Police are working on eliminating this issue. Only a few years ago a local police officer almost died from a local drug user. The shire needs to work with the police to try and stamp this issue out, to ensure the safety of the community is top priority.
We are indeed fortunate in having a well run Hospital, a well organised Ambulance centre and well trained volunteers, two police officer who live here (I believe) and a volunteer Fire and Emergency group. Emergency management is well organised.
Because Hyden looks after itself New Police very engaging and nice to have around, this has lifted the protection profile
Have has positive assistance when we have had emergencies
still lock my car most of the time
Police resources would be better used if stationed at Hyden
I feel safe, and I walk around town. I don't see this as something the shire can lay claim to.
Would be nice to see police officers out and about every now and then not just once in a blue moon.
More focus on trying to give youth some outlets Local police can step up. Seem to be missing in action
We did but Hyden has now changed with the extra travellers coming through town. The different type of people that we see on our road now, particular on the Hyden - Norseman Road has changed, from miners & the odd tourists to now all sorts moving from state to state. The Hyden hotel is not somewhere that feels comfortable anymore either, and incident that happened there from one of the Wind farm workers doesn't make me feel like I can have a couple of beers there without one of them getting a bit violent, I just don think some of them understand country people and country pubs.
Our St. John Ambulance and Emergency service volunteers do an amazing job, but it is disappointing that they are often hampered by city centric rules and regulations. I understand St. Johns want a Starlink service for their phone service which is being denied by St. John yet with all the traffic now travelling the Hyden-Norseman road due to Google maps sending travellers in that direction (which is new), these services are going to be required a long distance from the town, and in most cases, they will be without any vital mobile phone service. To me, a Starlink service is a no-brainer, but once again, city centric bureaucrats make decisions that are not compatible with remote living.
Hyden has influx of energy workforce - our community demographics have changed and im hearing reports of more anti social behaviour
Crime in Hyden is prevalent. You can ask anyone in town and they'll tell you where the local drug dealer lives???
Demographics of our community have changed over last 10-20 years. Happened throughout country towns?? Would like to see more of a police presence. Very comfortable with volunteer ambulance contributions to our community. Wonderful people.
If we are ever asked to evacuate, I hope you will say in which direction eg north, south east or west with ie towards Hyden, Kondinin, Narembeen or Lake grace, so we directionally challenged, know which way, while we are trying not to panic. The bush fire plan site, says where will you go?? I don't know.
Drugs in all towns in shires - police issues is public saftey, not shires
Crime is up, fire response is still good but stopping locals from attending fires is causing property damage. The last fire i attended my father and I single handedly saved a shed and house from going up. The fire truck didnt turn up till after we got it out. If we weren't there that house and she'd would be rubble.
I think there needs to be a policy of some description to reduce those using drugs or alcohol. Drug and alcohol testing should be a priority to reduce risk and have a zero tolerance on work contracts. Implementation should be a priority.

Install CCTV have rangers working with police and community services and if need be press charges to those repsonsible - send a clear message it will not be tolerated funding and support

Q22. The Shire is prepared for natural disasters and emergencies
We are left on lur own with limited resources and if it was not for our own machinery we would have been flooded. The last flood the Shire did not have enough red hats or signs for the road ad locals supplied own signage
no one is truly prepared for fire or flood
I am not aware of any preparedness. I am sure there is a proposal somewhere. The most I know about is fire bans posted on FB.
There seems to be a lot of planning in many areas of this. Response is often lead by community members, not the shire which isn't how it should necessarily be, as if things don't right, it's the shire left to pick up the pieces.
Unfortunately cannot comment here as have not seen any indication of this
For the amount of land the shire has and people that travel through, our services and facilities will be very stretched. We are already seeing signs of that. That's in reference to the lack of fire trucks and first responders to accidents.
Yes it is, as long as it isn't commandeered from a city office. We have had fire fighters come to Hyden taking over and then expecting locals to adhere to their rules and regulations without them understanding how fire fighting is controlled properly the country way. For instance, apparently back-burning is considered 'Arson!!' There would be people alive today in Esperance if the 'City' mob hadn't demanded certain fire fighting (country style) actions were unacceptable to them. Also, the Perth mob knock off at 5 p.m., but expect our volunteers to continue throughout the day and night, with the city mob calling the shots. Any Firefighters from the city should be under the command of our local Fire Brigade.
The amount of town-wide flooding in Hyden in just the last 40yrs is a testament to no effective flood modelling solutions or diversions being discussed or implemented

Great notice about the Telstra outage in Hyden. Would be helpful to update more often. Ravensthorpe shire is a good example of keeping the shire informed of road closures, fires and floods.
Q24. Growth and development are managed in a planned and balanced way
The Shire of Kondinin point blank refuses to develop residential and industrial land in Kondinin and has done for decades. It will be interesting to see how the Shire handles the next development of residential and industrial land in Hyden while ignoring other communities.
Housing has been a major issue for some time and shire could have been more proactive in this department. Shire involvement in most recent projects has been positive though
Unfortunately the shire and its council have not been meeting their commitments with housing in the area. From memory at the last community engagement meeting, we were advised the shire, and its council were required to build a minimum of One(1) house within the shire each year. The new CEO house and the 2 WACHS units are the first houses to be built in Kondinin in many years.
There is a shortage of building a commercial sites in Hyden. When some people have tried to do development Shire Building Inspectors have deliberately made it very difficult.
What growth and development every thing in Hyden is done by the Hyden people not the Shire has been a real struggle in the past

More inspections of food facilities should be done.
Many building and houses should be pressured to repair and improve as much as possible
There are too many rules and regulations regarding the serving of food in our community. It totally inhibits any opportunity to raise funds with cake stalls etc. Our community has catered for up to 320 people over two days, without anyone getting sick etc before we were targeted by health inspectors. It should be left entirely to the customer as to whether they chose certain food items, e.g. if they want cream with their scones, then cream it is. It is time responsibility for choice came back to the consumer. The necessity for having 'commercial kitchen' cooked food only, for a variety of community events, is an insult to the country cook. Country women have catered for years and years with no problems.
The person who runs all the food outlet buildings is not held responsible for health violations, broken equipment etc.
I hear varied comments on over zealous health and building inspectors. I have not experienced this, with my limited dealing. a food handling certificate to serve cuppas and cake at a market day, seemed a bit over the top, when no one has had illness from this.
The health inspector needs to do random inspections at places like the bakery, wildlife park, hotels, roadhouses etc, and these inspections should be unannounced.
If anything the inspections are a hinderance
Q26. Planning and building processes are fair and easy to understand

Q27. There is an adequate supply of housing available in the Shire
While there is a shortage of housing, there is a number of contributing factors, including Homeswest ignoring regional communities, Western Power not investing for staff (West Court units rented commercially to W/power rather than for there intended use) and a lack of confidence for private investment.

The Shire of Kondinin has absolutely no buy local, or local content policies. It has in the past, been standard practice for the Shire to send staff to Perth in a Shire truck to carry our procurement that could have be sourced from a number of local businesses. The Shire's preference to have maintenance and building work done by Perth contactors is more money going straight out of the region.
We have not seem anything to show that the Shire is supporting economic development. Other Councils regularly have politicians visiting or the Council is always meeting with decision makers - we have seen nothing to say that this Shire does that.
Local jobs are supported however sometimes not sustainable due to the local inability to provide or support
Housing problems
Need better shire housing for workers
Not always there have been projects where locals were not co sidered for the position
Hyden Discovery Centre should be supported to diversify the economy
Kondinin doesn't really have a town centre unlike Hyden. No knowledge of renewables. Tourism isn't a thing in Kondinin. We don't even have a cafe. Which is a serious let down. No footpath from the caravan park- I have seen people wandering around aimlessly. There isn't even a sign directing people to the IGA. There are definite tourism ventures that could be encouraged within the shire but is this the job of shire? I don't know.
As new resident of Hyden we have found it very hard to find local trades and services and that is understandable for a country town, but the shires website lacks current local business`s and is very out dated with a vast majority on the list no longer in business.
I see nothing Local builder lost a contract to out of town? Voted for by council??
There are no enough entry-level jobs available for locals.

Serviced blocks for industry need to be made available.
I think more can be done in this space but it's hard with no housing available in one town and people not liking the community atmosphere in another town.
No buy local policy is in place in the Shire. The recent awarding of the building maintenance contract to a Perth company, is testament to this. No industrial land is available for development in either Kondinin or Hyden.

Q33. Town centres and tourism contribute positively to the local community
Someone asked me where they could have a shower in Hyden. They were tourists and had driven a long way. They were just having a look at Waverock and then heading to Perth.
Town centres & tourism - an area that Kondinin needs to improve in. I have spoken to a number of tourists who wanted to find a cafe. Although one was promised, nothing has happened in this regard for a long time. The building that was originally intended to convert to a cafe is far too small and complaints that the roadhouse is too rough and dirty.

Yes, but I think the town of Hyden could be better set up. Public toilets are sub par standard and in a terrible location! We shouldn't be relying on the Town Hall toilets. Let set up dedicated Public Toilets on the main street- like Kondinin and Corrigin have. We have some much traffic and tourists go through, and the best we can provided is an old toilet block out the back of the hall??? It baffles me!
Tourism very important to hyden so it is very i portantto provide facilities to tourists
kondinin has almost nothing hyden is a bad puzzle at best
Coronation Park needs upgrading and maintaining public toilets and footpaths as it is the main stop for tourists in the Hyden townsite. It is important to maintain barbecues and picnic facilities otherwise you'll receive poor feedback.
Hyden lacks a 24/48 hr free camp spot near the 4 main points, the local pub, IGA, Bakery and Post office/general store. The town is missing out on a huge amount of grey nomads not stopping in Hyden, just look at the grey nomads face book page and the Not grey nomads pages and you will see Hyden come up a lot, they will visit wave rock and move on to the likes of Varley. If you were to place an old post box in free camp area and ask visitors to place any receipts from purchases in town you would be surprised how much extra income they bring to town. This would not affect any accommodation business' s in town as these are not the sort of travellers that would use them any ways.

We need our tourists however as a shire I believe we don't put enough emphasis or infrastructure to cater for them.
Wave Rock is a Shire owned recreation area and as such needs improvement The private caravan park and associated facilities need a huge upgrade - its a disappointing experience out there
We could do more. Caravan Park (Kondinin) often seems full. Very highly praised. Should be extended??
Wave Rock is a major reason people visit thus creating lots of employment and economic benefit. The proposed discovery centre in Hyden will boost both these. Coronation Park needs to be enhanced with footpaths, sealed parking and RV dump at hall toilets to encourage tourists to stop in town

Local history and heritage is not well protected in the Kondinin end of the Shire. For some 45 years the Lions Club has been trying to find space for a museum and the problem is ongoing. The problem is the lack of unused buildings in Kondinin (not sure what we are going to do about that) At present we have our collection in a small room int he Wests building however, this is far too small for the goods that have been donated. Hopeful this problem will be dissolved shortly as the community is very keen to have this project completed at a larger area.

Not always. The division between the towns is detrimental to the progression of the Shire as a whole. A much greater effort must be made by the Shire in the leadership in combining the attitudes of the people in the Western end of the Shire and the eastern end. It is disappointing that the Kondinin end football team choose to unite with a team in another shire rather than combine with the existing football teams that were in the shire. This is an example.

WALGA is undertaking sector engagement regarding Local Government electoral reforms expected to be proposed by the State Government.

In June 2025, Hon Hannah Beazley MLA, Minister for Local Government, expressed support for a four-year election cycle, citing concerns about voter fatigue and the rising costs of conducting biennial elections. These messages were repeated in Minister Beazley's address at WALGA's 2025 Local Government Convention, which also raised the possibility of compulsory voting. These comments have prompted renewed interest and discussion across the sector.

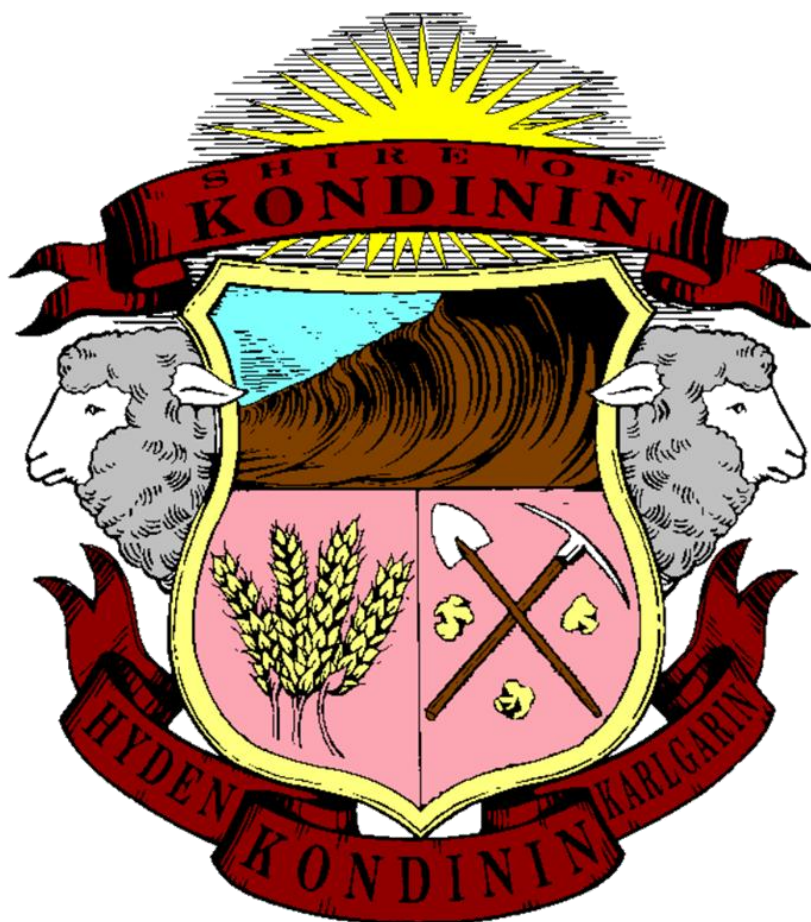
WALGA has contacted both the Department of Local Government, Industry Regulations and Safety (LGIRS) and the Minister's office seeking details of any consultation on these matters, but no further information has been provided.

By proactively progressing this consultation, WALGA is seeking to obtain sector feedback that will ensure WALGA's positions reflect the sector's current views and enable timely, well-informed and effective engagement with the anticipated State Government reform proposals.

Attached to this Infopage is a brief Discussion Paper. The Discussion Paper outlines some example considerations that Local Governments may choose to address when preparing their feedback. It is not intended to present an exhaustive or prescriptive list.

Local Governments are requested to provide Council endorsed responses to the Discussion Paper by 27 March 2026. This feedback will inform an item to be presented to State Council.

Employees Code of Conduct



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1 Introduction

The Shire of Kondinin Code of Conduct (the Code) provides employees with clear guidelines for the standards of professional conduct expected of them in carrying out their functions and responsibilities.

The Code addresses the broader issue of ethical responsibility and encourages transparency and accountability. The Code expresses the Kondinin's commitment to high standards of ethical and professional behaviour and outlines the principles in which individual responsibilities are based.

The Code is complementary to the principles adopted in the *Local Government Act 1995* (the Act) and associated regulations, which incorporate four fundamental aims:

- (a) better decision-making by local governments;*
- (b) greater community participation in the decisions and affairs of local governments;*
- (c) greater accountability of local governments to their communities; and*
- (d) more efficient and effective local government.*

1.1 Statutory environment

The Code addresses the requirement in section 5.51A of the Local Government Act 1995 (WA) for the Chief Executive Officer to prepare and implement a code of conduct to be observed by employees of the local government, and incorporates the matters prescribed in Part 4A of the Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996 (WA), including but not limited to regulations 19AA, 19AF and 19ADA relating to gifts, conflicts of interest and secondary employment.

The Code should be read in conjunction with the Act and associated regulations. Employees should ensure that they are aware of their statutory responsibilities under this and other legislation.

1.2 Application

For the purposes of the Code, the term employees includes persons employed by the Shire of Kondinin or engaged by the Shire of Kondinin under a contract for services or volunteers for the Shire of Kondinin. The Code applies to all employees, including the CEO, while on the Local Government's premises or while engaged in Local Government related activities. Clause 3.15 of this Code (Gifts), does not apply to the CEO as this is covered under Section 5.71A and Section 5.87B of the Local Government Act 1995

2 Vision/mission/values

The Shire of Kondinin Strategic Community Plan lists the Vision, Mission and values of the Shire and the community to be as listed below. Staff are encouraged to adopt and follow this vision, mission and values while in the workplace and behave in a manner upholding the standards of the Shire.

2.1 Our Vision

'To have a thriving and sustainable future'

2.2 Our Mission

We will achieve our vision by;

- Providing leadership in the community,
- Having a positive outlook,
- Bringing the community together,
- Providing and facilitating appropriate facilities and services,
- Being forward looking, and
- Having pride in our Shire.

2.3 Our Values

We will conduct our business with;

Respect

- Value people and places and the contribution they make to the Shire.
- Develop an environment of respect for different cultures
- Be appreciative of the aspirations of the community and what it does for itself

Inclusiveness

- Be receptive, proactive and responsive as an organisation
- Exist to help a community that has the capacity for self help
- Demonstrate leadership by promoting Council and community teamwork

Fairness and equity

- Maintain a 'whole of Shire' outlook, but recognise that each community is unique and likely to have variations on their needs
- Provide services for a variety of ages and needs
- Respond to the community in a fair and equal way depending on need
- Communication
- Create opportunities for consultation with the broad community
- Demonstrate leadership by promoting Council and community teamwork

3 Code of Conduct

3.1 Role of Employees

The role of employees in Local Government is determined by the functions of the CEO as set out in section 5.41 of the Act.

5.41. Functions of CEO

The CEO's functions are to:

- (a) *advise the council in relation to the functions of a local government under this Act and other written laws;*

- (b) ensure that advice and information is available to the council so that informed decisions can be made;
 - (c) cause council decisions to be implemented;
 - (d) manage the day to day operations of the local government;
 - (e) liaise with the mayor or president on the local government's affairs and the performance of the local government's functions;
 - (f) speak on behalf of the local government if the mayor or president agrees;
 - (g) be responsible for the employment, management supervision, direction and dismissal of other employees (subject to section 5.37(2) in relation to senior employees);
 - (h) ensure that records and documents of the local government are properly kept for the purposes of this Act and any other written law; and
 - (i) perform any other function specified or delegated by the local government or imposed under this Act or any other written law as a function to be performed by the CEO.
- Local Government Act 1995

3.2 Principles affecting employment by the Shire of Kondinin

The principles set out in section 5.40 of the Act apply to the employment of the Shire of Kondinin's employees:

- 5.40. Principles affecting employment by local governments**
- The following principles apply to a local government in respect of its employees —*
- (a) employees are to be selected and promoted in accordance with the principles of merit and equity; and
 - (b) no power with regard to matters affecting employees is to be exercised on the basis of nepotism or patronage; and
 - (c) employees are to be treated fairly and consistently; and
 - (d) there is to be no unlawful discrimination against employees or persons seeking employment by the Shire on a ground referred to in the Equal Opportunity Act 1984 or on any other ground; and
 - (e) employees are to be provided with safe and healthy working conditions in accordance with the Occupational Safety and Health Act 1984; and
 - (f) such other principles, not inconsistent with this Division, as may be prescribed.
- Local Government Act 1995

3.3 Personal Behaviour

Employees will:

- (a) act, and be seen to act, properly, professionally and in accordance with the requirements of the law, the terms of this Code and all policies of the Shire of Kondinin;
- (b) perform their duties impartially and in the best interests of the Shire of Kondinin, uninfluenced by fear or favour;

- (c) act in good faith (i.e. honestly, for the proper purpose, and without exceeding their powers) in the interests of the Shire of Kondinin and the community;
- (d) make no allegations which are improper or derogatory (unless true and in the public interest);
- (e) refrain from any form of conduct, in the performance of their official or professional duties, which may cause any reasonable person unwarranted offence or embarrassment; and
- (f) always act in accordance with their obligation of fidelity to the Shire of Kondinin.

3.4 Honesty and Integrity

Employees will:

- (a) observe the highest standards of honesty and integrity, and avoid conduct which might suggest any departure from these standards;
- (b) be frank and honest in their official dealing with each other; and
- (c) report any dishonesty or possible dishonesty on the part of any other employee to their Line Manager or the CEO in accordance with this Code and the Shire of Kondinin's policies.

3.5 Performance of Duties

While on duty, employees will give their whole time and attention to the Shire of Kondinin's business and ensure that their work is carried out efficiently, economically and effectively, and that their standard of work reflects favourably both on them and on the Shire of Kondinin.

3.6 Compliance with Lawful and Reasonable Directions, Decisions and Policies

- (a) Employees will comply with any lawful and reasonable direction given by any person having authority to make or give such an order, including but not limited to their Line Manager, Manager or the CEO.
- (b) Employees will give effect to the lawful decisions and policies of the Shire of Kondinin, whether or not they agree with or approve of them.

3.7 Administrative and Management Practices

Employees will ensure compliance with proper and reasonable administrative practices and conduct, and professional and responsible management practices.

3.8 Intellectual Property

The title to Intellectual Property in all duties relating to contracts of employment will be assigned to the Shire of Kondinin upon its creation unless otherwise agreed by separate contract.

3.9 Recordkeeping

Employees will ensure complete and accurate local government records are created and maintained in accordance with the Shire of Kondinin's Recordkeeping Plan.

3.10 Dealing with Other Employees

- (a) Employees will treat other employees with respect, courtesy and professionalism, and refrain from behaviour that constitutes discrimination, bullying or harassment.
- (b) Employees must be aware of, and comply with their obligations under relevant law and the Shire of Kondinin's policies regarding workplace behaviour and occupational safety and health, including:
 - STAFF-001 Community Services Leave
 - STAFF-002 Superannuation Contributions
 - STAFF-003 Retirement Gratuity
 - STAFF-004 Staff Housing
 - STAFF-005 Drugs and Alcohol in the Workplace
 - STAFF-006 Employer Unions – Authority to Act
 - STAFF-007 Staff uniform Allowance
 - STAFF-008 Employee Use of Plant and Equipment
 - STAFF-009 Occupational Safety and Health (OSH)
 - STAFF-010 Equal Employment Opportunity and Harassment
- (c) Employee behaviour should reflect the Shire of Kondinin's values and contribute towards creating and maintaining a safe and supportive workplace.

3.11 Dealing with community

- (a) Employees will treat all members of the community with respect, courtesy and professionalism.
- (b) All Shire of Kondinin services must be delivered in accordance with relevant policies and procedures, and any issues resolved promptly, fairly and equitably.

3.12 Professional Communications

- (a) All aspects of communication by employees (including verbal, written and electronic), involving the Shire of Kondinin's activities should reflect the status, values and objectives of the Shire of Kondinin.
- (b) Communications should be accurate, polite and professional.

3.13 Personal Communications and Social Media

- (a) Personal communications and statements made privately in conversation, written, recorded, emailed or posted in personal social media, have the potential to be made public, whether intended or not.
- (b) Employees must not, unless undertaking a duty in accordance with their employment, disclose information, make comments or engage in communication activities about or on behalf of the Shire of Kondinin, its Council Members, employees or contractors, which breach this Code.
- (c) Employee comments which become public and breach the Code of Conduct, or any other operational policy or procedure, may constitute a disciplinary matter and may also

be determined as misconduct and be notified in accordance with the *Corruption, Crime and Misconduct Act 2003*.

3.14 Personal Presentation

Employees are expected to comply with professional, neat and responsible dress standards at all times, in accordance with the Shire of Kondinin’s relevant policies and procedures.

3.15 Gifts

- (a) Application

This clause does not apply to the CEO.

- (b) Definitions

In this clause –

activity involving a local government discretion has the meaning given to it in the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996*;

activity involving a local government discretion means an activity —

- (a) that cannot be undertaken without an authorisation from the local government; or
- (b) by way of a commercial dealing with the local government;

[r.19AA of the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996*]

associated person has the meaning given to it in the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996*;

associated person means a person who —

- (a) is undertaking or seeking to undertake an activity involving a local government discretion; or
- (b) it is reasonable to believe, is intending to undertake an activity involving a local government discretion

[r.19AA of the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996*]

gift has the meaning given to it in the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996*;

gift —

- (a) has the meaning given in section 5.57 [of the *Local Government Act 1995*]; but
- (b) does not include —
 - (i) a gift from a relative as defined in section 5.74(1); or
 - (ii) a gift that must be disclosed under the *Local Government (Elections) Regulations 1997* regulation 30B; or
 - (iii) a gift from a statutory authority, government instrumentality or non-profit association for professional training; or



- (iv) a gift from WALGA, the Australian Local Government Association Limited (ABN 31 008 613 876), the Local Government Professionals Australia WA (ABN 91 208 607 072) or the LG Professionals Australia (ABN 85 004 221 818);

[r.19AA of the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996*]

gift means —

- (a) a conferral of a financial benefit (including a disposition of property) made by 1 person in favour of another person unless adequate consideration in money or money's worth passes from the person in whose favour the conferral is made to the person who makes the conferral; or

- (b) a travel contribution;

travel includes accommodation incidental to a journey;

travel contribution means a financial or other contribution made by 1 person to travel undertaken by another person

[Section 5.57 of the *Local Government Act 1995*]

relative, in relation to a relevant person, means any of the following —

- (a) a parent, grandparent, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, nephew, niece, lineal descendant of the relevant person or of the relevant person's spouse or de facto partner;

- (b) the relevant person's spouse or de facto partner or the spouse or de facto partner of any relative specified in paragraph (a),

whether or not the relationship is traced through, or to, a person whose parents were not actually married to each other at the time of the person's birth or subsequently, and whether the relationship is a natural relationship or a relationship established by a written law;

[Section 5.74(1) of the *Local Government Act 1995*]

prohibited gift has the meaning given to it in the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996*;

prohibited gift, in relation to a local government employee, means —

- (a) a gift worth the threshold amount or more; or
- (b) a gift that is 1 of 2 or more gifts given to the local government employee by the same person within a period of 1 year that are in total worth the threshold amount or more;

[r.19AA of the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996*]

reportable gift means:

- (i) a gift worth more than \$50 but less than \$300; or
- (ii) a gift that is 1 of 2 or more gifts given to the local government employee by the same person within a period of 1 year that are in total worth more than \$50 but less than \$300.

threshold amount has the meaning given to it in the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996*, subject to the CEO's determination under subclause (c);

threshold amount, for a prohibited gift, means —

- (a) a gift worth the threshold amount or more; or
- (b) a gift that is 1 of 2 or more gifts given to the local government employee by the same person within a period of 1 year that are in total worth the threshold amount or more;

[r.19AA of the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996*]

- (c) Determination

In accordance with Regulation 19AF of the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996*, the CEO has chosen not to determine a lesser amount.
- (d) Employees must not accept a prohibited gift from an associated person.
- (e) An employee who accepts a reportable gift from an associated person is to notify the CEO in accordance with subclause (f) and within 10 days of accepting the gift.
- (f) The notification of the acceptance of a reportable gift must be in writing and include:
 - (i) the name of the person who gave the gift; and
 - (ii) the date on which the gift was accepted; and
 - (iii) a description, and the estimated value, of the gift; and
 - (iv) the nature of the relationship between the person who is an employee and the person who gave the gift; and
 - (v) if the gift is one of two or more accepted from the same person within a period of one year:
 - (1) a description;
 - (2) the estimated value; and
 - (3) the date of acceptance,
 of each other gift accepted within the one year period.
- (g) The CEO will maintain a register of reportable gifts and record in it details of notifications given to comply with subclause (f).
- (h) The CEO will arrange for the register maintained under subclause (g) to be published on the Shire of Kondinin’s official website.
- (i) As soon as practicable after a person ceases to be an employee, the CEO will remove from the register all records relating to that person. The removed records will be retained for a period of at least 5 years.

3.16 Conflict of Interest

- (a) Employees will ensure that there is no actual (or perceived) conflict of interest between their personal interests and the impartial fulfilment of their professional duties.



- (b) Employees will not engage in private work with or for any person or body with an interest in a proposed or current contract with the Shire of Kondinin, without first disclosing the interest to the CEO. In this respect, it does not matter whether advantage is in fact obtained, as any appearance that private dealings could conflict with performance of duties must be scrupulously avoided.
- (c) Employees will lodge written notice with the CEO describing an intention to undertake a dealing in land which is within the district of the Shire of Kondinin, or which may otherwise be in conflict with the Local Government's functions (other than purchasing the principal place of residence).
- (d) Employees who exercise a recruitment or any other discretionary function will disclose any actual (or perceived) conflict of interest to the CEO before dealing with relatives or friends and will disqualify themselves from dealing with those persons.
- (e) Employees will conduct themselves in an apolitical manner and refrain from political activities which could cast doubt on their neutrality and impartiality in acting in their professional capacity.
- (f) Community Involvement
 - (i) The Shire acknowledges and supports employee participation in community groups, sporting organisations and not-for-profit activities.
 - (ii) Employees must ensure that such involvement does not create, or give rise to, an actual, potential or perceived conflict of interest.
 - (iii) Employees must disclose any involvement in a community group or organisation where the employee:
 - may be involved in decision-making affecting that organisation; or
 - may obtain a direct or indirect benefit.
 - (iv) Where a conflict exists, employees must:
 - take no part in any decision-making process relating to the matter;
 - not attempt to influence any other employee or decision-maker; and
 - comply with any direction provided by the Chief Executive Officer or delegate.
 - (v) Employees must not use their position to improperly influence outcomes for any community group, organisation or individual with which they are associated.

3.17 Secondary Employment

- (a) Employees must not engage in secondary or outside employment (whether paid or unpaid) without prior written approval from the Chief Executive Officer.
- (b) Employees are required to disclose any existing or proposed secondary employment to the Chief Executive Officer, or their delegate, prior to commencement and must update this disclosure where circumstances change.
- (c) Approval may be granted where the secondary employment:

- (i) does not conflict, or is not perceived to conflict, with the employee's duties;
 - (ii) does not adversely affect the employee's performance or availability; and
 - (iii) does not involve the use of Shire resources, information or influence.
- (d) The Chief Executive Officer may refuse, place conditions on, or require the cessation of secondary employment where a conflict of interest or other risk is identified.
 - (e) Employees must not use their position, Shire resources, or confidential information to benefit their secondary employment.

3.18 Disclosure of Financial Interests

- (a) All employees will apply the principles of disclosure of financial interest as contained within the Act.
- (b) Employees who have been delegated a power or duty, have been nominated as 'designated employees' or provide advice or reports to Council or Committees, must ensure that they are aware of, and comply with, their statutory obligations under the Act.

3.19 Disclosure of Interests Relating to Impartiality

- (a) In this clause, **interest** has the meaning given to it in the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996*.

interest —

- (a) means an interest that could, or could reasonably be perceived to, adversely affect the impartiality of the person having the interest; and
- (b) includes an interest arising from kinship, friendship or membership of an association.

[r.19AA of the *Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996*]

- (b) An employee who has an interest in any matter to be discussed at a Council or Committee meeting attended by the employee is required to disclose the nature of the interest:
 - (i) in a written notice given to the CEO before the meeting; or
 - (ii) at the meeting immediately before the matter is discussed.
- (c) An employee who has given, or will give, advice in respect of any matter to be discussed at a Council or Committee meeting not attended by the employee is required to disclose the nature of any interest the employee has in the matter:
 - (i) in a written notice given to the CEO before the meeting; or
 - (ii) at the time the advice is given.
- (d) A requirement described under (b) and (c) excludes an interest referred to in Section 5.60 of the Act.
- (e) An employee is excused from a requirement made under (b) or (c) to disclose the nature of an interest because they did not now and could not reasonably be expected to know:
 - (i) that they had an interest in the matter; or
 - (ii) that the matter in which they had an interest would be discussed at the meeting and they disclosed the nature of the interest as soon as possible after the discussion began.

- (f) If an employee makes a disclosure in a written notice given to the CEO before a meeting to comply with requirements of (b) or (c), then:
 - (i) before the meeting the CEO is to cause the notice to be given to the person who is to preside at the meeting; and
 - (ii) at the meeting the person presiding must bring the notice and its contents to the attention of persons present immediately before a matter to which the disclosure relates is discussed.

- (g) If:
 - (i) to comply with a requirement made under item (b), the nature of an employee's interest in a matter is disclosed at a meeting; or
 - (ii) a disclosure is made as described in item (e)(ii) at a meeting; or
 - (iii) to comply with a requirement made under item (f)(ii), a notice disclosing the nature of an employee's interest in a matter is brought to the attention of the persons present at a meeting,the nature of the interest is to be recorded in the minutes of the meeting.

3.20 Use and Disclosure of Information

- (a) Employees must not access, use or disclose information held by the Shire of Kondinin except as directly required for, and in the course of, the performance of their duties.
- (b) Employees will handle all information obtained, accessed or created in the course of their duties responsibly, and in accordance with this Code, the Shire of Kondinin's policies and procedures.
- (c) Employees must not access, use or disclose information to gain improper advantage for themselves or another person or body, in ways which are inconsistent with their obligation to act impartially and in good faith, or to improperly cause harm, detriment or impairment to any person, body, or the Shire of Kondinin.
- (d) Due discretion must be exercised by all employees who have access to confidential, private or sensitive information.
- (e) Nothing in this section prevents an employee from disclosing information if the disclosure:
 - (i) is authorised by the CEO or the CEO's delegate; or
 - (ii) is permitted or required by law.

3.21 Improper or Undue Influence

- (a) Employees will not take advantage of their position to improperly influence Council Members or employees in the performance of their duties or functions, in order to gain undue or improper (direct or indirect) advantage or gain for themselves or for any other person or body.
- (b) Employees must not take advantage of their position to improperly influence any other person in order to gain undue or improper (direct or indirect) advantage or gain, pecuniary or otherwise, for themselves or for any other person or body.
- (c) Employees must not take advantage of their positions to improperly disadvantage or cause detriment to the local government or any other person.

3.22 Use of Shire of Kondinin Resources

(a) In this clause –

Shire of Kondinin resources includes local government property and services provided or paid for by the Shire of Kondinin;

local government property has the meaning given to it in the Act.

local government property means anything, whether land or not, that belongs to, or is vested in, or under the care, control or management of, the local government
 [Section 1.4 of the *Local Government Act 1995*]

(b) Employees will:

- (i) be honest in their use of the Shire of Kondinin resources and must not misuse them or permit their misuse (or the appearance of misuse) by any other person or body;
- (ii) use the Shire of Kondinin resources entrusted to them effectively, economically, in the course of their duties and in accordance with relevant policies and procedures; and
- (iii) not use the Shire of Kondinin 's resources (including the services of employees) for private purposes (other than when supplied as part of a contract of employment), unless properly authorised to do so, and appropriate payments are made (as determined by the CEO).

- (a) Employees may report suspected unethical, fraudulent, dishonest, illegal or corrupt behaviour to their supervisor, Manager, or the CEO in accordance with Shire of Kondinin's Policy GOV-001 Code of Conduct.
- (b) In accordance with the *Corruption, Crime and Misconduct Act 2003*, if the CEO suspects on reasonable grounds that the alleged behaviour may constitute misconduct as defined in that Act, the CEO will notify:

 - (ii) the Public Sector Commissioner, in the case of minor misconduct.

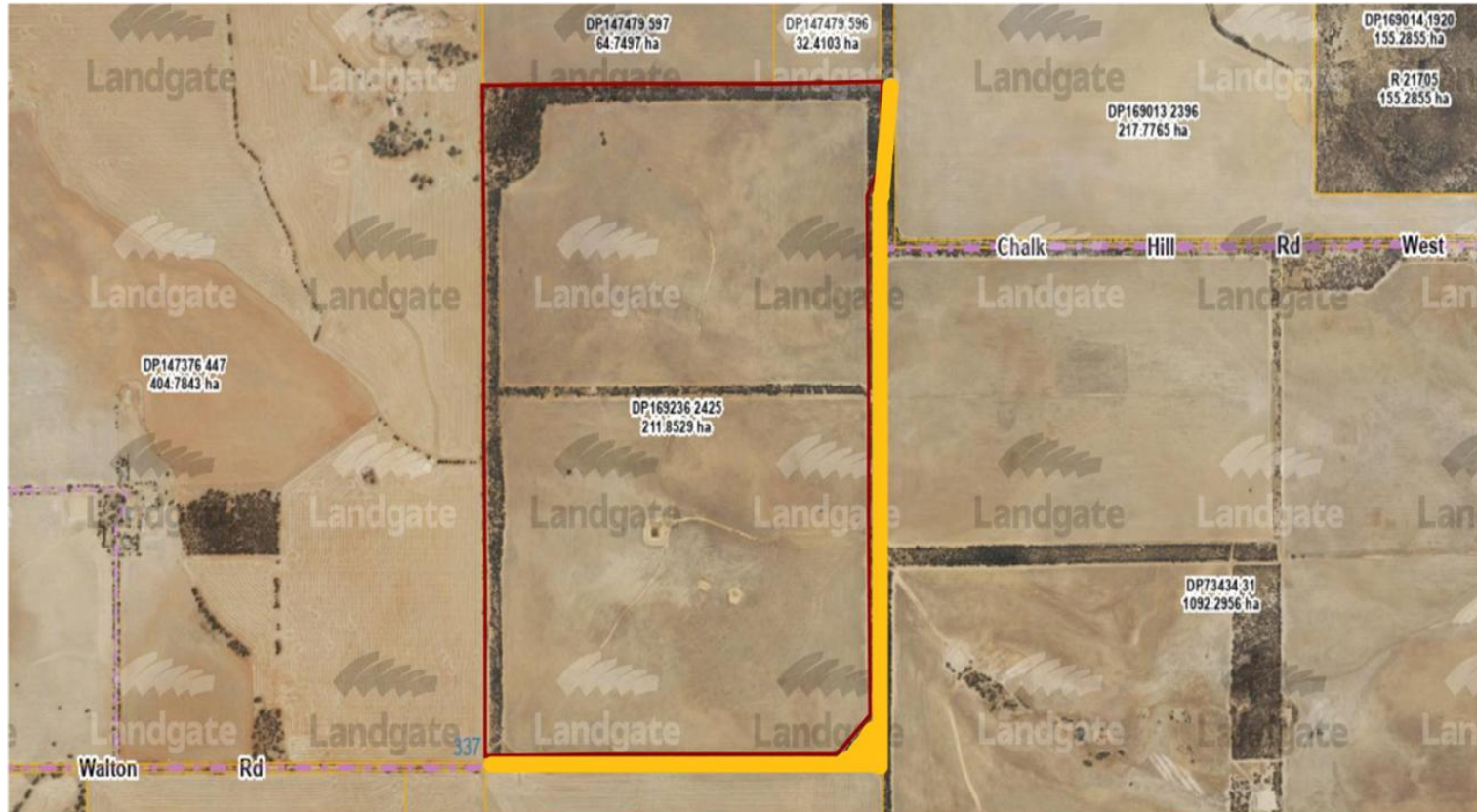

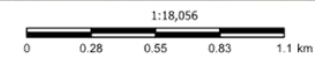

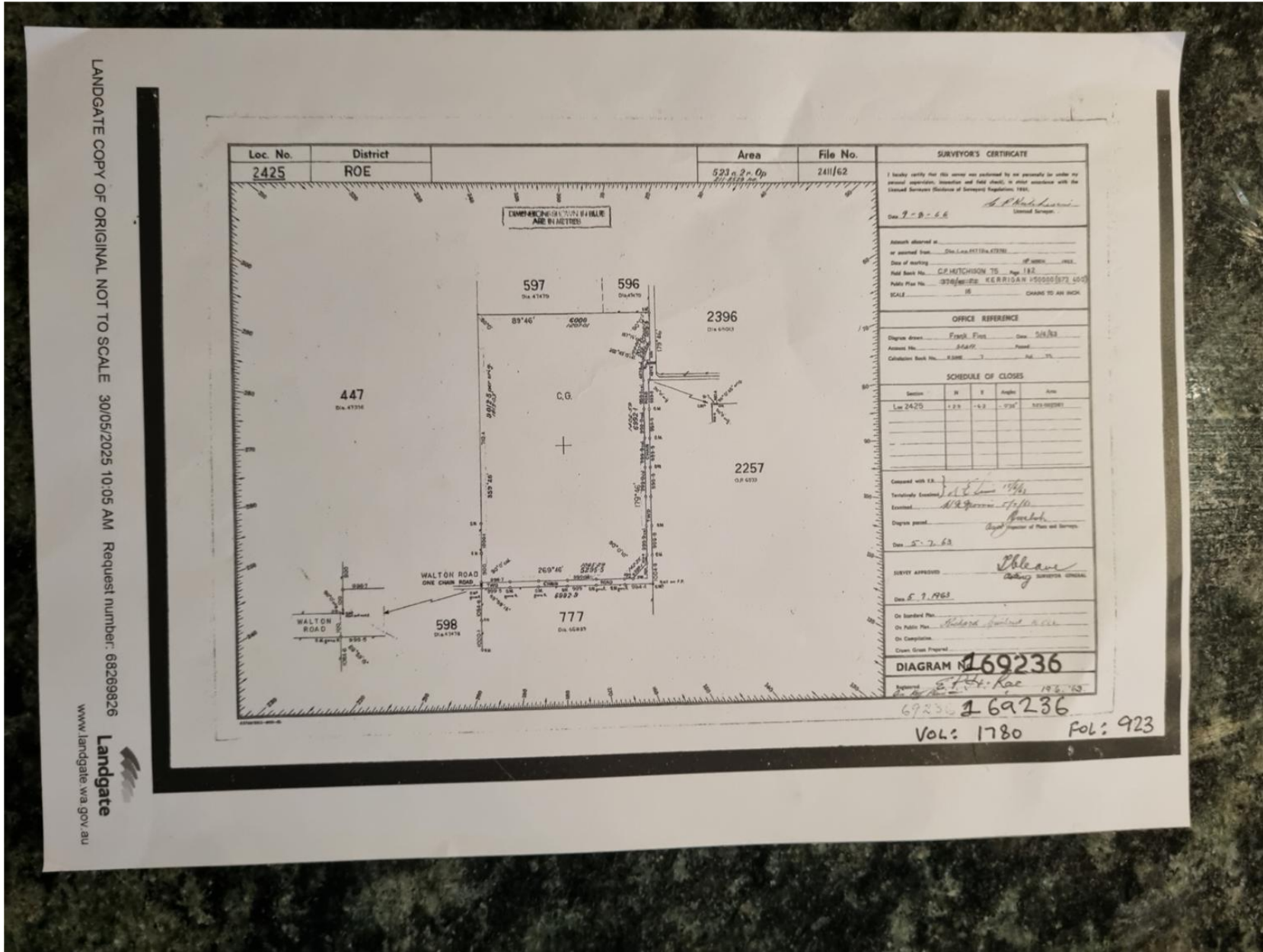

The purpose of this report is to seek direction from Council to on whether to submit a request to the Minister to close the local road reserve (Land ID 3662697) that runs along the southern and eastern boundary of Lot 2425 on DP 169236 Walton Road, Karlgarin to amalgamate with the adjoining land.

Background

The Shire of Kondinin administration have been approached by the landowner of Lot 2425 on DP169236 seeking consideration of the formal closure of the public road reserve that runs along the southern and eastern boundary to enable the reserve to be amalgamated into the subject landowner's freehold property. The reason for the request from the landowner to purchase the crown land was described to the Shire to align the boundary line with the fence line, like the northern and western boundary lines of Lot 2425 Walton Road, Karlgarin, with the existing native vegetation in the road reserve proposing to remain similar to that existing along the northern and western boundary of Lot 2425.

A site visit has been undertaken by the Shire's Administration indicating that the section of the public road reserve to be closed will not change the current access of the subject property and surrounding lots, with access remaining from Walton Road, Chalk Hill West Road and Karlgarin East Road, Karlgarin.

Hi Bruce , please present this to all council members at the next Shire meeting December 10th 2025 .

1) There is only an average of 4 km from Chalk Hill Rd West where gazetted Walton Rd 1963 would meet up to , the 2 other current roads used for east / west access these 2 roads are Karlgarin East Rd and Pederah Rd East . I measured these distances in a vehicle and have enclosed a map. At Aylmore Rd the eastern end this is a bitumen road and the western side a gravel Medcalf Rock Road .

2) It would cost \$1 million or more to construct this gazetted Walton Rd portion 1963 of approximately 10km including clearing of bush / trees for approximately 5 km and upgrading the current totally unmaintained sections of Chalk Hill Rd West and Western section of the current Walton Road . This is totally uneconomic thus why it has not been done in the past 63 years considering it is only an average of 4 km to the 2 other currently used and maintained roads . During the advertising period there was only 1 landowner expressing the idea of the ideal to have this road but it could not be justified for the cost and such a very low volume of traffic . It would be a total waste of rate payers funds and the state government would not fund it either as it has a zero priority to save an average of 4 km and the huge cost to achieve it .

I have enclosed photos of the bush / trees.

3) 3 km west on the current unmaintained Chalk Hill Rd a landowner has his fence and a locked gate with a padlock for the past 75 years using newer padlocks over the period .I have enclosed photos of this .

4) If I requested the Shire Of Kondinin to construct this gazetted eastern portion of Walton Rd 1963 the answer will be no so it needs to be cancelled by the Shire Of Kondinin so the state government department can proceed with what they have agreed with me in principal which is the potential sale of some land within the fence lines of my Lot 2425 . These funds could be made on request to The Shire Of Kondinin to be used in a useful way . The state government needs the gazetted road to cancelled or it cannot proceed with any process at all .

5) I undertake to allow any light vehicle to travel through my land lot 2425 using the firebreak track on the edge of my paddocks with no gates to open and close as I have no livestock it is a continuous cropping farm and will remain this way . This is more and better than what is currently available which is zero access from East to West Aylmore Road to Medcalf Rock Road through this route .

6) So I request please the Kondinin Shire Councillors to vote to close this gazetted eastern section of Walton Road 1963 as it is totally uneconomic to construct with already other well maintained roads within an average of 4 km away and some progress can be made with the Lands and Heritage Department of the Government Of Western Australia

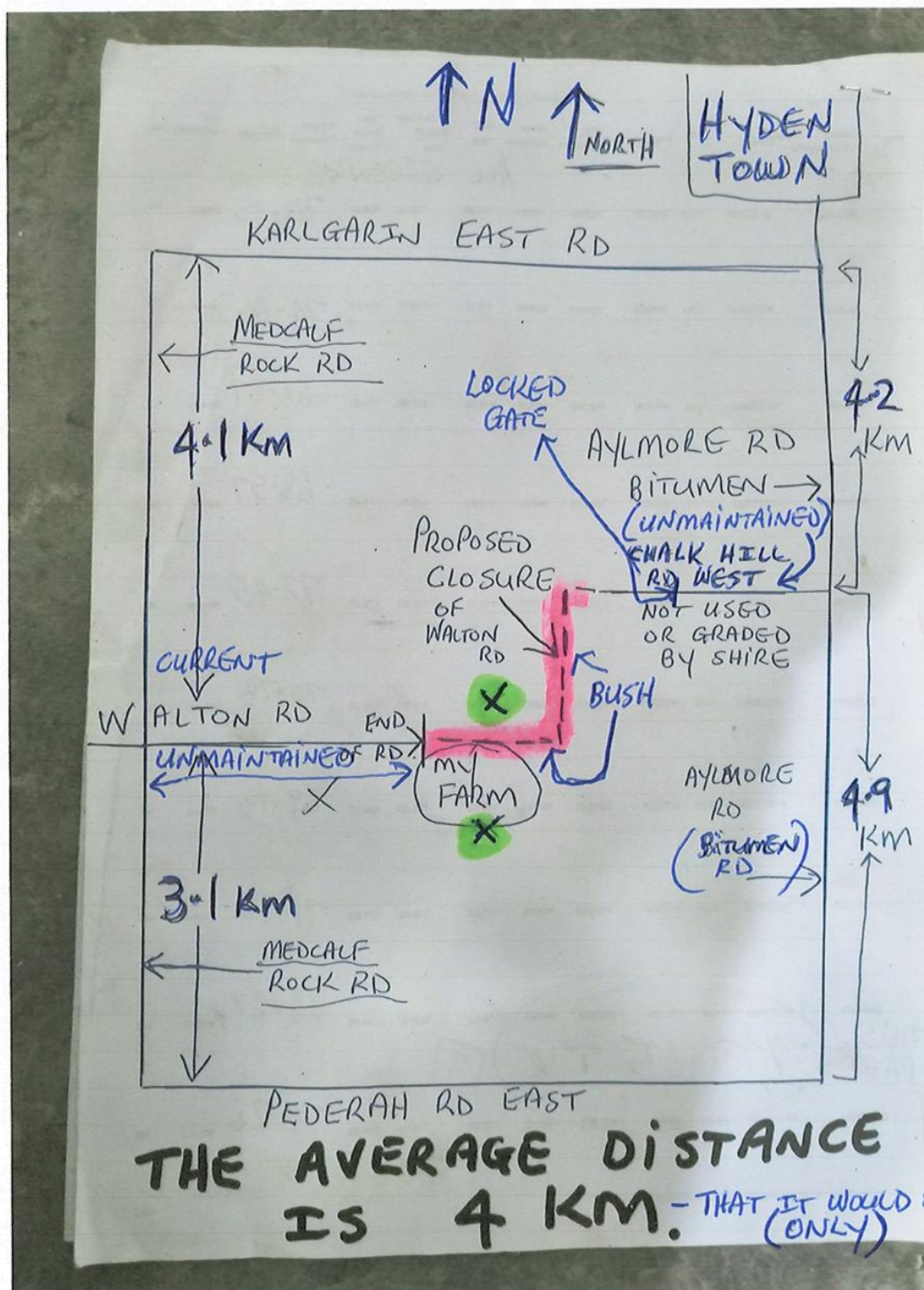

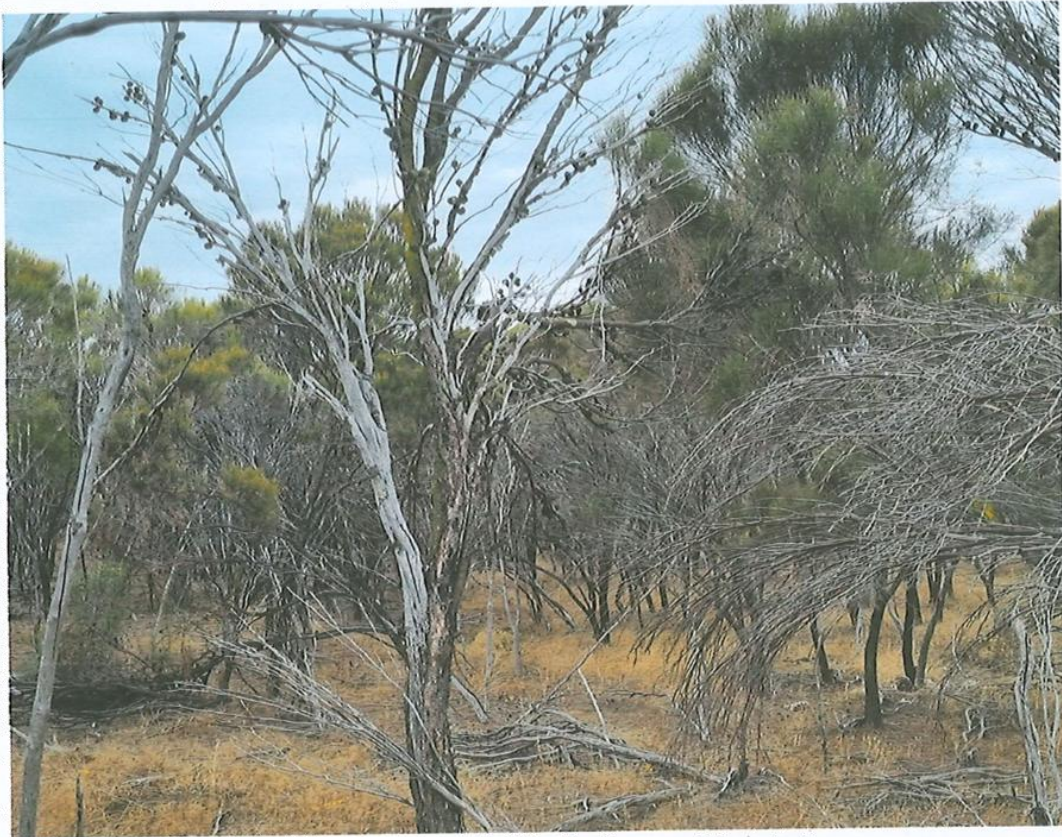


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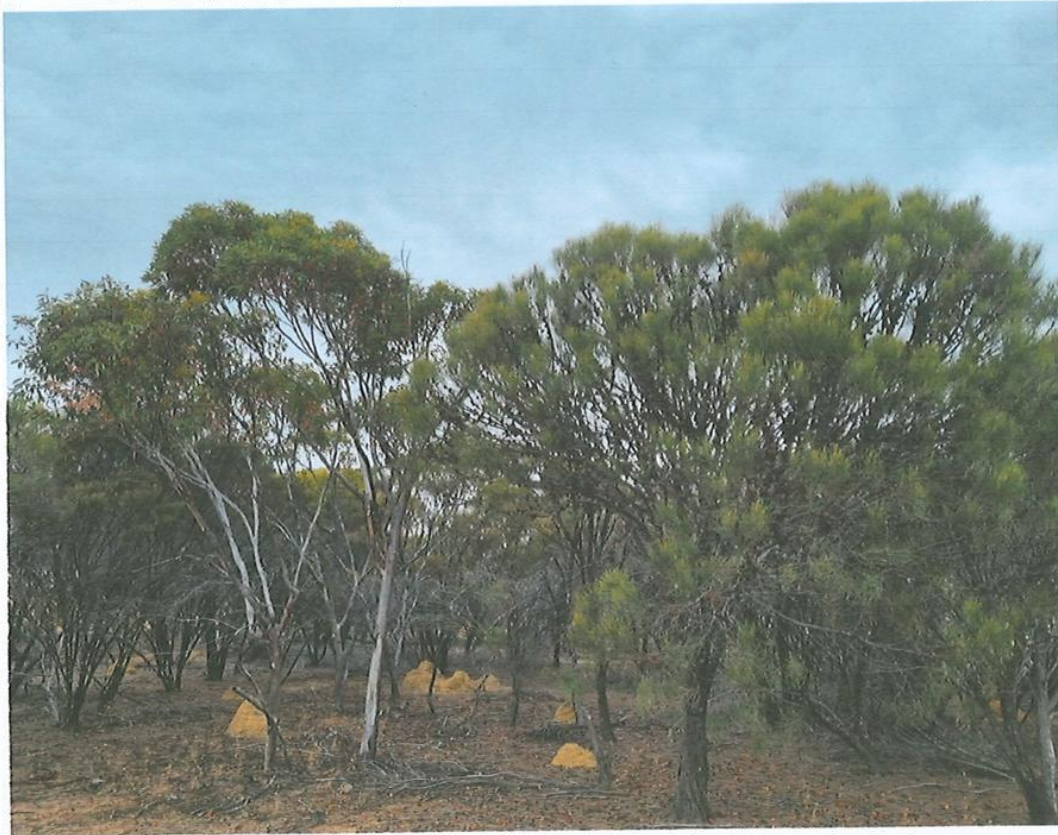
