WHAT IS ROEROC

The ROE Regional Organisation of Councils (RoeROC) is a voluntary organisation of like minded Local Governments, consisting of the Shires' of Corrigin, Kondinin, Kulin and Narembeen.

This voluntary group of Councils seeks to work collaboratively in a manner which enhances and assists in the advancement of the RoeROC region. The purpose of RoeROC is to advocate

for growth and

sustainability of key services and infrastructure across the members Local Government communities. The group has already had success with a regional waste facility and shared environmental health services. RoeROC is a voice for our

communities and will actively

collaborate and agree on regional approaches to regionally significant issues and opportunities.



HOUSING STUDY

The RoeROC Shires are participating in a study in conjunction with the Wheatbelt Development Commission to analyse housing demand for workers within the Shires of Corrigin, Kondinin, Kulin and Narembeen.

The study seeks to understand the current housing stock needs and the demand into the future. The demand analysis will distinguish between demand for housing across the public and private sectors. The evidence will be used to prepare a cost-benefit analysis to inform business cases and supporting grant applications.

Thank you to the business and community members that participated in the recent survey, this data will be crucial in gaining a clear picture of the demand.

We will keep the communities informed as we make progress on this significant project.

KONDININ WIND FARM



PROJECT UPDATE

Shell Energy and Foresight Group partnered to acquire Kondinin Energy Limited from Goldwind and Lacour Energy less than two years ago, in October 2022. Read on to learn more about the project's progress.

Project partners Shell Energy and Foresight Group are continuing to work with stakeholders including landholders, Kondinin Shire Council, the state government, regulators and the WA energy sector to advance Stage 1 of the Kondinin Wind and Solar Project. Once operational, the 130MW asset will have the capacity to generate enough energy to power up to 70,000 Western Australian homes.

Our project team have continued to gather the technical, economic, environmental and heritage information required to take a Final Investment Decision and start construction. Since January this year, these activities have included:

- Completing surveys and studies to meet legal and regulatory standards. These include:
 - oEnvironmental survey – identifying soils, landforms, vegetation, habitat, ecosystems, flora and fauna
 - oCultural heritage survey – identifying potential places of cultural heritage significance
 - oContamination study – identifying any existing soil contaminants
 - oAviation study – modelling the wind farm's interface with aerial movements
 - oConnection studies – simulating the wind farm's performance within the Western Power network.
- Optimising project design to incorporate evolving wind generation technology and the outcomes of relevant surveys.
- Working with multiple government and regulatory parties who own and/or will develop the supporting infrastructure required to connect the energy generated by the wind farm into the state electricity grid via the South-West Interconnected System.
- Negotiating commercial supply agreements with end-users of the wind energy.
- Finalising selection of an Engineering, Procurement and Construction (EPC) provider to lead construction and an Operation & Maintenance (O&M) provider to lead post-construction activities.
- Undertaking familiarisation visits with equipment manufacturers.
- Ongoing landholder and neighbour visits.
- Community Consultative Committee meetings in March and July.

In coming months, we look forward to continuing negotiations with the owners and developers of supporting infrastructure including transmission lines and potential commercial end-users of Kondinin's wind energy.

During the next quarter, we also expect to:

- Initiate further geotechnical assessments to inform detailed design and construction.
- Undertake a transport route survey for turbine delivery.
- Undertake early works planning and permitting.
- Develop virtual imagery of the wind farm.

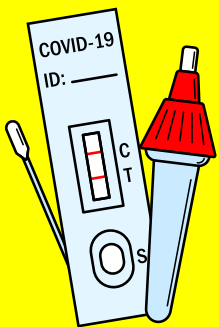

INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this Business Plan is to:

1. Inform the community the Shire of Kondinin is working with the Hyden CRC and Hyden Progress Association to develop the Wave Rock (Katter Kich) Discovery Centre;
2. Provide opportunity for the community to consider and make informed submission on the Business Plan;
3. Satisfy the requirements of Section 3.59 of the Local Government Act 1995

Wave Rock (Katter Kich) Discovery Centre

The Wave Rock (Katter Kich) Discovery Centre will consist of:

- An area for the Shire of Kondinin Office;
- An area for the Hyden CRC with better street frontage than the current location;
- A Theatre for events and displays;
- A Meeting Room for Shire, CRC and Public use;
- A Discovery Centre to display information and showcase local heritage;
- A Workshop/Gallery space; and
- A Retail Area for tourism associated industries.

The Shire is seeking funding from Federal and State Grants for the facility with contributions from the Shire of Kondinin, Hyden Progress Association, Hyden CRC and other sources.

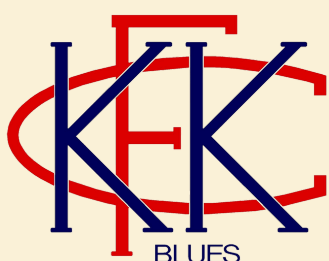


Comedy Gold toured through Hyden on the 20th of August. The event was held at the Hyden Memorial Hall. This was a great social event full of laughter!

Council Meetings

For the August Ordinary Council Meeting, the following was discussed:

- The Shire approved a response being submitted for land to being considered as part of the South West Native Title Claim.
- Council approved staff seeking funding under the Regional Airports Development Scheme for the sealing of the Kondinin airstrip.
- Council authorise another application for funding for extending the sealed surface of the Hyden-Norseman Road. This will look at another \$5m in roadworks for this road.
- Council approved the construction of the new building for the Karlgarin Bowling Club.
- A change of name was approved for some properties currently listed as the Kondinin Roads Board to be changed to the Shire of Kondinin.
- An update on the construction of a new building for the Hyden Tennis Club
- Council approved staff seeking funding through the Bicycle Networks Grant for a funding bike paths around Kondinin and Hyden.
- An Update on the Discovery Centre was provided for Council.
- The Shire of Kondinin Housing Policy was reviewed and approved.
- A waiver of fees for an out-of-shire school to attend Wave Rock was not approved by Council.

Discovery Centre Business Plan

- The Shire is currently in the consultation period for the Wave Rock (Katter Kich) Discovery Centre. Submissions on the Business Plan are open until close of business 30th August 2024

Shire of Kondinin Tourism Master Plan

- The Shire has recently completed the draft Shire of Kondinin Tourism Master Plan, which will shortly be released for public comment.
- We would like to thank the many volunteers who helped the Shire piece together the Plan and the many great ideas that came through.
- This will be a living document to be reviewed regularly and also include further consideration for improving tourism to our towns, provide an additional income stream.

Regional Housing Project

- Many thanks to those who completed the surveys for housing for the ROEROC Regional Housing Project. This will provide valuable information on housing shortages for our towns and look at possible assistance to improve the current situation.

Hyden Mural – Coronation Park

- The mural in Coronation Park has started and we will see the development of this artwork over the next few weeks as it starts to take shape.

Closure of Hyden Norseman Road – September – Dates to be confirmed

- Due to increasing costs, the Shire will be closing the Hyden-Norseman Road in the coming weeks to allow the next section of road works to be completed while there is still moisture in the gravel and also to reduce traffic control costs. We are trying to maximise the amount of sealing works that can be completed with the current funding.

Pea and Ham Soup



Time: 2Hrs 55mins



Serves: 4



Ingredients

290g (1 1/3 cups) green split peas
2 tbsp olive oil
2 carrots, peeled, chopped
2 sticks celery, trimmed, chopped

1 Brown onion, halved, chopped
3 garlic cloves, crushed
700g ham or bacon hocks
1.5L (6 cups) cold water
Crusty bread, to serve

Method

Step 1

- Rinse split peas under cold running water until water runs clear. Drain.

Step 2

- Heat oil in a saucepan over medium heat. Add carrot, celery, onion and garlic, and cook, stirring, for 5 minutes or until the onion softens.

Step 3

- Add split peas, ham hocks and water. Bring to the boil over high heat. Reduce heat to medium-low and simmer, covered, for 2 - 2 1/2 hours or until ham hocks are tender and the meat is falling away from the bones.

Set aside for 5 minutes to cool slightly. Remove ham hocks from pan. Remove the meat from bones. Coarsely chop meat and set aside.

Step 4

- Place one-quarter of the pea mixture in the bowl of a food processor and process until smooth. Return to pan with ham. Repeat with remaining pea mixture. Taste and season. Stir over medium-high heat for 5 minutes or until hot.

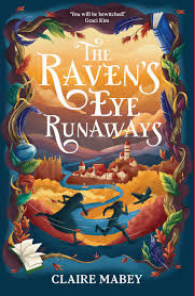
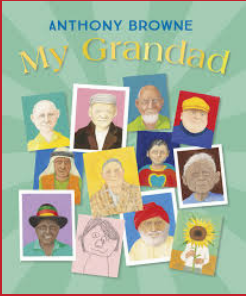
Step 5
