



# Share your town and rural lifestyle with doctors of the future

More than 100 second-year medical students from Curtin University will participate in the Curtin Medical School Student Rural Immersion Week, with the aim of inspiring them to pursue careers in rural Western Australia.

During their stay, they will visit local farms, industry, general practices, hospitals and schools, and engage in community activities.

Do you live in or near Brookton, Corrigin, Dalwallinu, Katanning, Kondinin, Kulin, Moora or Wongan Hills?

As a host, we will ask you to provide accommodation for two or more students for three nights, be able to assist with transporting them to/from town, and share what it is like to live in your town with the students.

You are invited to come along to a Thank You dinner with the students on the Thursday night.





#### Why host?

If you live in or near one of these towns we would love to hear from you!

This is a life-changing experience for the students, with many having no previous exposure to rural life.

By providing these rural immersion opportunities early in their degree, it has been proven that students are more likely to explore rural career opportunities and have a better understanding of treating rural patients.

Some students continue to keep in touch and visit their host families, some return to do seasonal work and placements, others have joined mentoring programs and some have inspired host family members to pursue tertiary studies in health and medicine.

# For the December Ordinary Council Meeting, the following was discussed:

- Council approved an Access
   Agreement with CBH for water
   for the town ovals in Kondinin.
- An Agreement between the Education Department and the Shire for use of the Hyden Oval will remain on the table to allow for more information.
- The endorsement of the Electromagnetic Interference Study for the Kondinin Wind Farm will remain on the table for more information.
- Council approved forming an easement for the cycle path to Wave Rock.
- An approval of boundary realignment for the Kondinin Sporting Precinct was passed.
- Access Agreements for Synergy were approved by Council for access to water for the King Rocks Wind Farm.
- The Shire's Financial Reports for November 2024 were received.
- Council adopted the Audited Annual Financial Report for 2023/24.
- Some interest on a few rates accounts was written off.

- An update on the Discovery Centre was received.
- The Shire adopted 3 new Policies as recommended by the Audit Report.
- The Policy for Council Meetings was updated.
- Ordinary Meetings for 2025 were adopted.
- The Shire of Kondinin (formerly Kondinin Road Board) will reach 100 years of operation mid next year, the Shire will be considering celebrations for the event.

# Traditional Christmas Trifle



# **Ingredients**

- 4 x Aeroplane Original Strawberry jelly crystals
- 2 1/2 cups boiling water
- 1/2 x 800g light fruit cake, cut into 3cm cubes
- 2 tbsp brandy (optional)
- 2 cups Pauls Double Thick French Vanilla custard
- 1 cup fresh raspberries or frozen raspberries
- 125g fresh strawberries, hulled, sliced
- 300ml thickened cream
- 1 tsp icing sugar mixture, sifted
- 50g <u>white chocolate</u>, grated
- Fresh raspberries, to decorate
- Hulled, quartered strawberries, to decorate

## **Method**

Step 3

 Place jelly crystals in a heatproof bowl. Add boiling water. Stir to dissolve crystals. Stir in 400ml cold water. Refrigerate for 1 hour or until just starting to set (it should have a thick, syrupy consistency).

## Step 2

Step 1

Arrange cake in a 13 cupcapacity serving bowl.
Drizzle with brandy, if using.
Spoon half the jelly over top.
Top with custard. Sprinkle with raspberries and strawberries. Spoon remaining jelly over top.
Refrigerate, covered, overnight.

Using an electric mixer, beat cream and sugar in a bowl until soft peaks form. Fold through chocolate. Spoon mixture over trifle. Top with raspberries and strawberry quarters. Serve. You could use leftover fruit cake or pudding in this trifle. Double Thick custard is twice as thick as pouring custard, and ideal for the whole family. Check out the handy resealable pack for recipe suggestions. You could replace brandy with orange juice. Top trifle with grated chocolate.
