At the Ordinary Meeting of Council on Wednesday 19 November 2025, Council endorsed:

South West Native Title Settlement: The State of Western Australia has committed to allocation 320,000 hectares of Crown land to the Noongar People to create the Noongar Land Estate. The Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage is managing the allocation and notified the Shire of eleven (11) properties within the Shire that are proposed for inclusion in the Settlement. The Council has approved the Shire to register interest in the properties with the Noongar Boodja Trustee and Ballardong Aboriginal Corporation for future housing development.

Committee Memberships: The Shire holds a seat at various external Committees that include, but are not limited to: Roads Management, Bio Security, Tourism, Western Australian Local Government Association, Regional Operations Advisory (DFES), Roe Regional Organisation of Councils and LGIS Risk Management. Each of these Committees is a significant contributor to support ongoing Shire operations and strategic planning. The Shire is required by our governing legislation to form an Audit, Risk and Improvement Committee that is chaired and co-chaired by independent members and the balance of membership is three (3) of our Councillors – this Committee oversees the Shire's financial management, risk and governance. We are also required by governing legislation to form a Local Emergency Management Committee that incorporates a broad continuum of members; the Committee supports local emergency management arrangements for the Shire across planning, response and recovery – a strong focus is creating community resilience to emergencies. Lastly, the Shire operates an Infrastructure & Assets and a Medical & Community Services committee to provide planning, operating and strategic oversight of the Shire's services. The Council elected and appointed representative Councillors to each of these committees for the next two (2) years.

**Financial Reports:** The Council endorsed the October list of accounts and financial reports. These identify Shire transactions and our monthly financial reports.

**Award of Works:** The Council endorsed and approved the CEO to authorise road works on Lovering & Mount Walker Roads, Pederah West North Lake Karlgarin and the resealing of a number of residential area roads within Hyden.

**2026 Schedule of Meetings:** The Council endorsed the 2026 schedule of Council meetings and the Annual Electors Meeting and the Shire end of year closure.

**Policy Review:** During August 2025, the Council set aside the current Shire Policy Manual for a review and update (as required) of existing policies. This process has commenced, and the Council endorsed and approved the first policy review and adopted the Shire Discrimination, Harassment and Bullying policy.

**Disposal of Property:** The Shire owns property at 6 Cottle Way, Kondinin. The Shire was approached by a local business to purchase this property to enable it to extend service capability throughout the Shire. Council endorsed the acceptance of the offer pending prescribed processes under the Local Government Act. Very soon, a Notice of Proposed Disposition will be advertised to allow community members to provide commentary or feedback on the proposed sale.

Local Government Rural Health Funding Alliance: During January 2025, an alliance of six (6) Regional WA Councils developed a position paper on the Provision of Remote GP Services. In short, the Alliance is seeking the Australian Local Government Association to commit to an impact assessment on local governments providing GP services in remote areas. Our Shire has recently retained Livingston Medical to support various medical services throughout the Shire; this is an expense of the Shire. Council endorsed it's support of the Alliance in various advocacy efforts to reduce the burden on local governments throughout Regional Western Australia.

Our swimming pools are now open for the season, and early attendance numbers have been very encouraging. On behalf of the Shire and our communities, I extend sincere thanks to our pool operators and their teams for the outstanding facilities and services they continue to provide.

We are also delighted to welcome Livingston Medical, who commenced services in the Shire on Monday, 17 November. A warm welcome to Rachael, Michael, and the team. We are already receiving excellent feedback regarding their work at the clinics and the Kondinin Hospital. We look forward to the arrival of their resident doctor in the New Year, while continuing to value the ongoing services of Dr Mackie.

The Administration is preparing to present the Shire's 2024–2025 Annual Report to Council in December. Subject to this process, we anticipate holding the 2025–2026 Annual Electors Meeting in February 2026. This meeting will be held in Hyden, and we encourage the community to watch for updates confirming the date and location.

Looking ahead, 2026 will be a significant year for the Shire as we begin developing a new Council Plan outlining our short-, medium-, and long-term goals, strategies, and works programs. Community involvement will be central to this process. A community survey will be released shortly and will remain open throughout December, January, and February. We strongly encourage everyone to participate—more details will follow.

I have recently had the pleasure of attending several community group meetings and activities throughout the Shire and have been inspired by the enthusiasm and impact of these groups. If you have an upcoming meeting or event, please let me know—I would very much welcome the opportunity to attend.

On a final note, we will soon say farewell to our Works Manager Mark Burgess – thank you for your long and dedicated service to the Shire Mark, you will be missed but your legacy will live on. All the very best to you and yours on the next adventure!

# FIRE BREAK NOTICE

# FIRE BREAKS

You are required on or before 31 October each year, to plough, scarify, cultivate, spray or otherwise clear and maintain free of all inflammable material until 30 April the next year, firebreaks on the land owned or occupied by you pursuant to the powers contained in section 33 of the Bush Fires Act 1954.

# **RURAL LAND**

Firebreaks not less than 3 metres wide as follows:

- i) Immediately inside all external boundaries of the land or rural holding and if any portion of the land or rural holding adjoins a public road or railway line a firebreak must also be constructed along that boundary.
- ii) Immediately surrounding all buildings, haystacks and fuel ramps situated on the land. Please contact the Shire for the requirements of setting fire to prepared bush.

# **TOWNSITE LAND**

All townsitelots 2.012ha (5 acres) or less shall be clear of all inflammable materials and grass must be mown to a height of no greater than 15cm.

All town site lots or a combination of lots that comprise of one holding and greater than 2.012 ha (5 acres) require fire breaks of 1.25m wide on all boundaries and immediately surrounding all buildings.

If permission is not granted by Council or a duly authorised officer you shall comply with this Notice.

Some students continue to keep in touch and visit their host families, some return to do seasonal work and placements, others have joined mentoring programs and some have inspired host family members to pursue tertiary studies in health and medicine.



# Water supply in a bushfire

This information could save your life



While leaving high-risk bushfires is the safest option, if you plan to stay and defend your home, you must have an INDEPENDENT water supply and pumping capability. This typically requires water tanks of at least 20,000 litres, pump and generator.

This is required as mains water supply and pressure cannot be guaranteed during a bushfire due to the risk of power cuts, fire damage and extreme demand.

Use the Department of Fire and Emergency Services resources to develop your personal bushfire plan: mybushfireplan.wa.gov.au You can also download the My Bushfire Plan app via the App Store or Google Play to access your bushfire plan anytime - even without an internet connection.

To support bushfire plans, if you have groundwater bore access to surface water, you can take and store emergency water without it counting against your annual entitlement. For more information on this, and for the location of emergency bushfire water supplies in dryland agricultural areas, visit the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation website.

### Drinking water

We recommend you keep a supply of drinking water on hand throughout summer in case your water supply is interrupted.

# Assistance for customers affected by bushfire

After a bushfire, we can assist you with issues such as damaged water meters and payment difficulties. If you have been affected by bushfire please call us on 13 13 85.
